This report serves as an overview of BUSHIES current impact, and future direction. It outlines what we've achieved from a social and environmental standpoint.


It also highlights our weaknesses, what we've struggled to achieve and what we could be doing better.

MATERIAL CHOICES

We actively pursue the best performing, environmentally conscious materials. Our initiatives include sourcing from FSC certified Eucalyptus plantations for TENCEL™, adhering to Lenzing's Wood & Pulp Policy, and incorporating recycled or natural materials where possible. - A lack of 100% biodegradability for our garments.


2024 ONGOING PROJECTS & GOALS

- Research into bio-based elastane solutions.
- Review of wood based cellulose as the key raw material input for our fibres.
- Research into closed loop recycling/reclaiming of raw materials inputs that go into our garments.
- Complete end of life solution implementation.



LABOUR PRACTICES

Manufacturing in Australia has been a core pillar in the BUSHY business model.
Highlighting that is still possible to manufacture high quality garments here, whilst also adhering to strict labour policies & practices.
Our ongoing commitment via the Ethical Clothing Australia accreditation ensures that everyone within our supply chain is paid at award rates that provide a fair and living wage. As our business grows we're excited to integrate more Australian manufacturers of all kinds into our supply chain. Further elevating their stories and channelling capital back into the Australian garment manufacturing industry.

Planting trees is a core offset action based on our utilisation of a wood based fibre. Creating connection between raw material and garment, whilst providing a solution to a portion of our consumption.

This year we agreed to plant one tree in various locations around the world for every pair sold. It's definitely not the perfect answer, in some senses quite tokenistic, however at this stage of the business it's fulfilling it's purpose. We'll review how we can improve our impact in this area in 2024.

FIRST NATIONS FUTURES

Our business operates on First Nations land therefore we feel it's only right to pay the rent. Working with First Nations Futures has given us the opportunity to collaborate with an organisation that redistributes wealth and collectively invests in First Nations initiatives to create intergenerational change. This is just the beginning of our journey in this area of impact, much more to come.

BAYSDIE COMMUNITY COLLECTIVE

Supporting people who are currently homeless or going through challenging life events with simple amenities such as clean underwear is a very small action we offer. Working with Bayside Community Collective in Frankston, Melbourne we send any deadstock left over from production which is then redistributed to people in need.







Through our connection to Benny Roche, Vice Captain of the Pararoos we were able to support the team during their 2023 IFCPF Asia-Oceania Championship run. Each member of the Pararoos received a BUSHY package as a show of support to the team. We plan to continue creating connection with the Pararoos by donating resources and funds.

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
