

LINEN

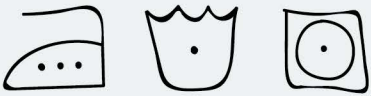
- A natural textile made from the fibers found in the stem of the flax plant.
- One of the oldest textiles in the world, laborious to manufacture - considered luxurious for its quality and exceptional coolness + freshness in hot weather.
- Slubs are part of the aesthetic appeal + do not compromise the integrity of the fabric.

PROPERTIES:

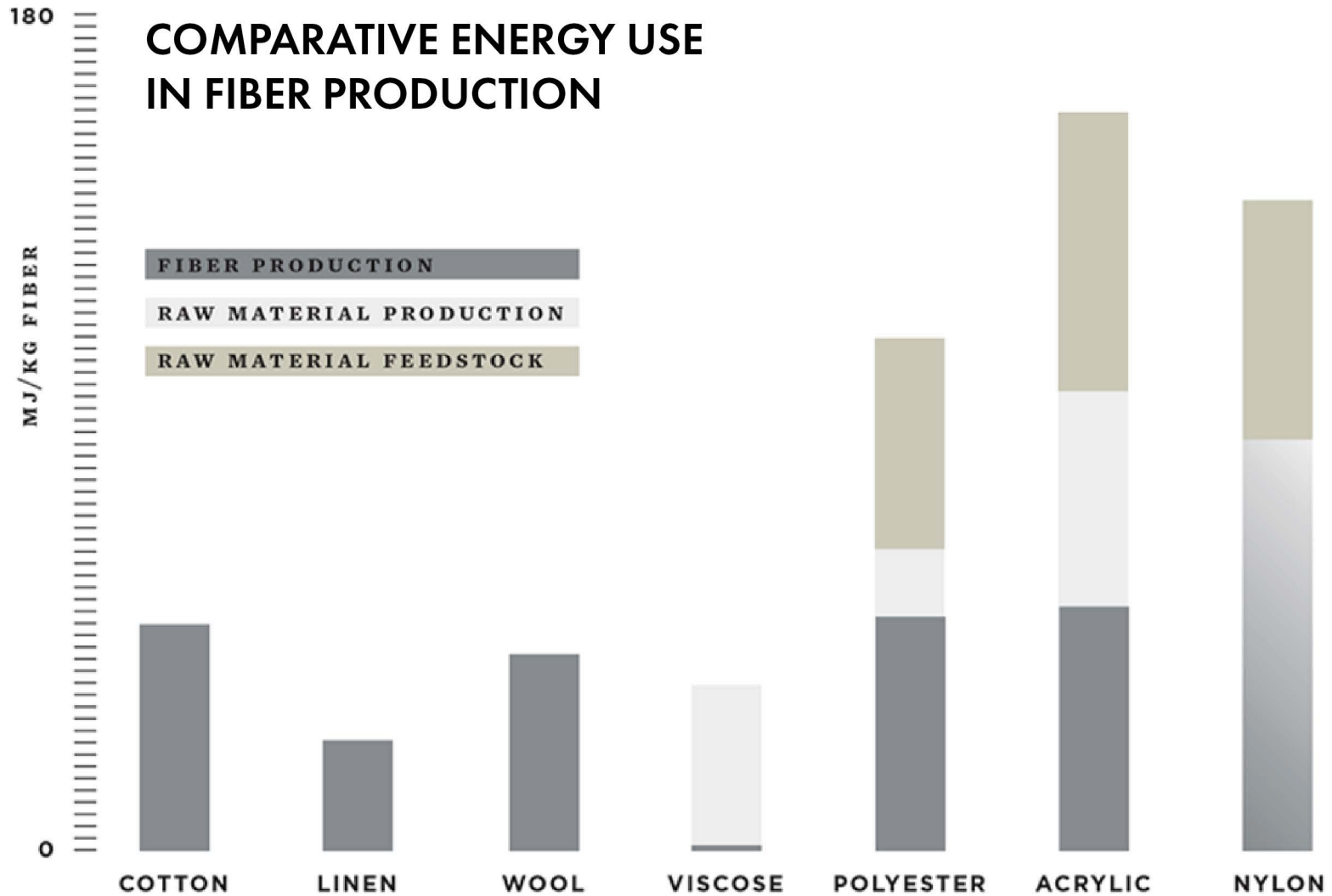
- Breathable.
- Absorbs perspiration quickly without feeling damp to the skin.
- Fibers do not stretch or pill.
- Softens over time.
- Wrinkles easily.
- Does not build up static.
- High heat tolerance.
- Environmentally-friendly (see next page).

CARE:

- Machine washable.
- Wash on gentle cycle with cold water. Tumble dry low.
- Linen can be worn crisp + perfectly pressed or care-free, and naturally rumpled. Options are as follows:
 - Leave unpressed for a natural look.
 - Remove from dryer while still damp + hang to dry.
 - Press on high heat with steam to remove wrinkles.
