

BLUE RIDGE INSTALL GUIDE

FOR: 4RUNNER ATTIC

Welcome! This installation isn't rocket science but it is kind of like karate - you can hurt yourself or break something if you don't pay attention. Used properly, this Install Guide will tell you all you need to know - like Yoda, but with better grammar.

TOOLS NEEDED: 10mm Socket & Wrench







STEP #1

Begin by removing the cover to reveal the 10mm bolt securing each of the rear coat hook hangers in the cargo area (2 total).





STEP #2

Using the 10mm socket wrench, remove the bolt.





STEP #3

Place the bolt you just removed into the webbing attachment point and reinstall with the webbing underneath the hook hangers. Do this for both the driver and passenger sides.

STEP #4

Once both the attachment points are in place, the rear of the attic can then be loosely attached via the G-Hooks on the attic.

To attach the front attic straps to the grab handles loop them over the grab handles and attach the G-Hooks back to the attic itself (do not attach the G-Hooks back to the webbing)



STEP #5

Tighten to the desired tension using the G-Hook attachments, as well as, the lower paracord lacing with barrel lock.

STEP #6

Get in your vehicle and go adventuring!
