## Fort Worth Fabric Studio's Altogether Spooky Quilt Finished Size: 35 " $\times 35$ "

## General Instructions:

All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted. All seams are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted. $\mathrm{RST}=$ right sides together.

## Fabric A:

-(1) 5.5 " strip. Sub-cut (4) 5.5 " $\times 5.5$ " squares
Fabric B:
-(1) $5.5^{\prime \prime}$ strip. Sub-cut (4) $5.5^{\prime \prime} \times 10.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (be careful to fit between selvages)

## Fabric C:

-(1) 5.5 " strip from WOF piece. Sub-cut (6) 5.5 " X 5.5 " squares

- (1) 5.5 " strip from 22 " piece. Sub-cut (2) 5.5 " X 5.5 " squares

Fabric D :
-(1) 6" strip. Subcut (2) 4" $\times 4$ " squares and (4) $1.5 " \times 2.5$ " rectangles

## Fabric E :

-(1) 6" strip. Subcut (2) 4"x 4" squares

## Fabric F:

-(1) 4" strip. Sub -cut (2) 4"x 4" squares, (4) 1 7/8"x
8.5 " rectangles

## Fabric G:

-(2) $3.25^{\prime \prime}$ strips from WOF piece.
-(1) 4" strip out from 6"x10" piece. Sub -cut (2) 4"x 4" squares

## Fabric H :

-(1) 6" strip. Sub-cut (4) 6" x 8.5" rectangles
Fabric I:
-(2) 3.25 " strips
Fabric J:
-(2) 3.25 " strips

## Fabric K:

-(1) 2" strip. Sub-cut (4) $17 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
Fabric L :
-(1) 2" strip. Sub-cut (4) $17 / 8$ " $\times 8.5$ " rectangles

## Fabric M:

- (2) $4.75^{\prime \prime}$ strips. Sub-cut (8) $4.75^{\prime \prime} \times 9.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
-(1) 3 " strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 " $\times 4.25$ " rectangles
- (1) 2.5 " strip. Sub-cut (4) 1.5 " $\times 2.5$ " rectangles
-(1) 2.25 " strip. Sub-cut (16) 2.25 " $\times 2.25$ " squares
Fabric N :
- (5) 2.5 " strips for binding
-(1) 4" 4 4" square
Fabric O:
-Save for backing


## General Instructions:

All seams are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted. RST= right sides together.

## Pumpkin Block:

1. Pumpkin Body: Use (4) H and (16) $M-2.25^{\prime \prime} \times 2.25^{\prime \prime}$ squares. On the back of $M$ squares, draw a line corner to corner. With RST, place M squares on each corner of H rectangles as shown. Stitch on the drawn line. Trim \& press seam toward orange print. Make 4 blocks.

2. Pumpkin Stem: Use (4) M-1.5" $\times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles and (4) D-1.5" $\times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Place all M and D wrong sides up and measure upwards, $3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from the lower left corner of each. (Fig. 3) Mark. Draw line from this point to lower right corner. Cut on line. With RST, match edges along cut lines \& stitch. NOTE: points should extend on either side by about 1/4". (Fig. 4) Press seam toward purple. Trim each stem evenly to $1.25^{\prime \prime} \times 3$ ". (Fig. 5) Make 4 stems.

Using (8) M-3"x $4.25^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles, sew $M$ rectangles to each side of Pumpkin Stem. (Fig. 6) IMPORTANT: Use a scant $1 / 4 "$ seam allowance. Press seams toward stem. Trim to 3 "x $8.5^{\prime \prime}$. Make 4.

3. Pumpkin Assembly: With RST, stitch stem block from step 2 to pumpkin body from step 1. (Fig. 7) Press Seam toward pumpkin body. Trim to 8.5 "x 8.5 " square. Make 4 .

## General Instructions:

All seams are 1/4" unless otherwise noted. RST= right sides together.

## Candy Corn Blocks:

1. Use (8) M-4.75" $\times 9.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles: With right sides UP, sub-cut 4 rectangles from lower left corner to upper right corner. Sub-cut remaining 4 rectangles from upper left corner to lower right corner.
IMPORTANT: carefully label these triangles \#1-4 as shown. (Fig. 1) We recommend starching the briangees.

2. Use (2) G- $3.25^{\prime \prime}$ strips, (2) l-3.25" strips, and (2) J-3.25" strips. With RST, sew strips together lengthwise as shown: G on top (hats \& boots in upright position), J middle, I bottom (pumpkins facing you). (Fig. 2) Press seams toward top (fabric G). Make 2 sets of strips.

3. Cut paper template (included with kit) on SOLID line. Note that all 3 corners are clipped off - make sure to cut template exactly as printed. Lay strip sets on cutting mat with pumpkins on the bottom. (Pay close attention to the direction of the prints) Using one strip set \& the template, cut 4 triangles point down (witch hats will be on the widest part of triangle). (Fig. 3) From the 2 nd strip set, cut 4 triangles point up (witch hats will be on the point section of triangle). (Fig. 4)

4. Use pieces \#1-4 from step 1 and candy corn from step 3. IMPORTANT: when attaching side triangles, use a $1 / 8$ " seam allowance. Side triangles will be slightly larger than candy corn sides- make sure side triangle tips extend evenly on either side of the candy corn units before sewing. After sewing the first side triangle, fully press seam toward candy corn before attaching second side triangle. Attach as shown in Figure 5 \& Figure 6. Press second triangle seam toward candy corn. Trim finished blocks if needed, to $8.5^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Be careful to leave a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance at the candy corn point.

## General Instructions:

All seams are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted. RST= right sides together.

## Star Block:

1. Use (4) B- $10.5^{\prime \prime} \times 5.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles and (8) C- $5.5^{\prime \prime} \times 5.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Draw a diagonal line (corner to corner) on the back of Fabric C squares. Place a C square on upper left corner of rectangle B (RST) \& stitch on drawn line. Trim \& press toward dark print. Repeat for upper right corner. (Fig. 1) Blocks should finish at $10.5 " \times 5.5$ ". Trim if needed, but do not trim off points. Make a total of 4 Flying Geese

2. For center 9 patch block: use 4 " squares from Fabrics D, E, F, G, N. Place squares according to Figure 2. Sew together: row 1, row 2, and row 3. Press row 1 to the right, row 2 to the left, row 3 to the right. Stitch rows together from top to bottom to complete 9 patch block. Press. Trim to $10.5^{\prime \prime} \times 10.5^{\prime \prime}$ (approximately $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on all 4 sides).

3. Assemble star block. Use (4) A-5.5" $\times 5.5$ " for the corners, flying geese from step 1 , and 9 patch block from step 2. Use Figure 3 for placement - make sure flying geese blocks are pointing in the right direction. Stitch row 1: square block to flying geese block to square block. Press seams toward right. Stitch row 2: flying geese block to 9 patch block to flying geese block. Press seams toward left. Stitch row 3: square block to flying geese block to square block. Press seams toward right. Stitch rows together from top to bottom to complete the star block. Press. Block should finish at $20.5^{\prime \prime} \times 20.5^{\prime \prime}$.

## General Instructions:

All seams are $1 / 4$ " unless otherwise noted. RST= right sides together.

## Assembly:

1. Use pumpkin blocks \& candy corn blocks For stashing, use (4) F- $17 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles, (4) K-1 $7 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5$ " rectangles, and (4) L-1 7/8" $\times 8.5$ " rectangles. Make 2 side borders. (Fig. 1) Make 1 top border (Fig. 2). Make 1 bottom border (Fig. 3). Press all seams toward gashing pieces.

2. Using the diagrom below (Fig. 4), lay out the quilt as shown. IMPORTANT: Make sure borders are oriented correctly before final assembly. Sew side borders to right \& left sides of center star. Seams may be pressed either direction. Attach top \& bottom borders. Seams may be pressed either direction. Use the backing \& binding provided in your kit, to quilt \& bind with your preferred methods.
