

Hatch Gloves Cleaning Recommendations

IMPORTANT! Below is only general guidance for the procedure and cleaners that can be safely used without causing adverse material affects. Please consult the Center for Disease Control (CDC) website at www.CDC.gov for the most up to date guidelines on specific cleaning and disinfecting procedures.

Below are important guidelines to properly disinfect Hatch® glove products including leather and synthetic gloves.

- Visibly dirty surfaces should be cleaned prior to disinfection.
- DO NOT USE BLEACHING AGENTS, such as Clorox. Bleach may cause discoloration and staining.
- Use only <u>EPA-registered disinfectant</u> wipes. Use only wipes that don't contain bleach.
- Refer to product label for the required contact time (how long the disinfectant should remain on the surface), the product shelf-life, and all safety instructions prior to handling and use.
- The surface should remain 'visibly wet' for the prescribed contact time in order to produce disinfection. NOTE: If the surface is not kept wet for the appropriate amount of time to kill the microorganisms, it is possible to spread microorganisms with the wipe.
- After prescribed disinfectant contact time, surface may be wiped dry, or the surface may be allowed to air dry.
