# **SECTION 6: ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES**

Insufficient data to be sure of status. Expected to not be an environmental hazard. Biodegradation studies indicate that 2-butoxyethanol will be readily degraded by microorganisms present at sewage treatment plants. Ready biodegradability tests showed that it achieved a biodegradation rate of greater than 77% after 3 days and 100% after 7 days. A 20-day biochemical oxygen demand test and an OECD 28-day closed bottle test gave it degradation rates of 75% and 88% respectively. Literature data confirm these results.
