- NO PREP: No more long nights rigging/prepping bait or those expensive last minute stops to the frozen bait section. When you choose a Fathom lure, it's ready when you are. Fathom Offshore lures are intended to be pulled as-is, without bait.

SIZE AND PLACEMENT:


Typically larger more aggressive lures are run closer to the boat. For example: if you are running a small lure spread for meatfish, mix in a few mediums on the flat lines. This offers the occasional larger fish a more sizable alternative and acts as a teaser to help your smaller offerings get noticed. Smaller lures with less action are run further back with bullets heads producing well in the shotgun.

LURE HEAD ACTIONS:

Concave and Flat: Designed to grab water and pop prior to diving back down expending a sizable bubble trail. 6 - 7 second period.

Slant and Angled: When surfacing, slant heads will push water upwards in a skiing motion before re-entering the water. 4 - 5 second period.

Bullets: Kept sub-surface, these straight running lures won't be seen often. However, a slight surface ripple produced on top is irresistible to prey.



WITH OUTRIGGERS

6 lure, 2 Squid Chains, 1 dredge.

5 lures, 1 dredge.
