

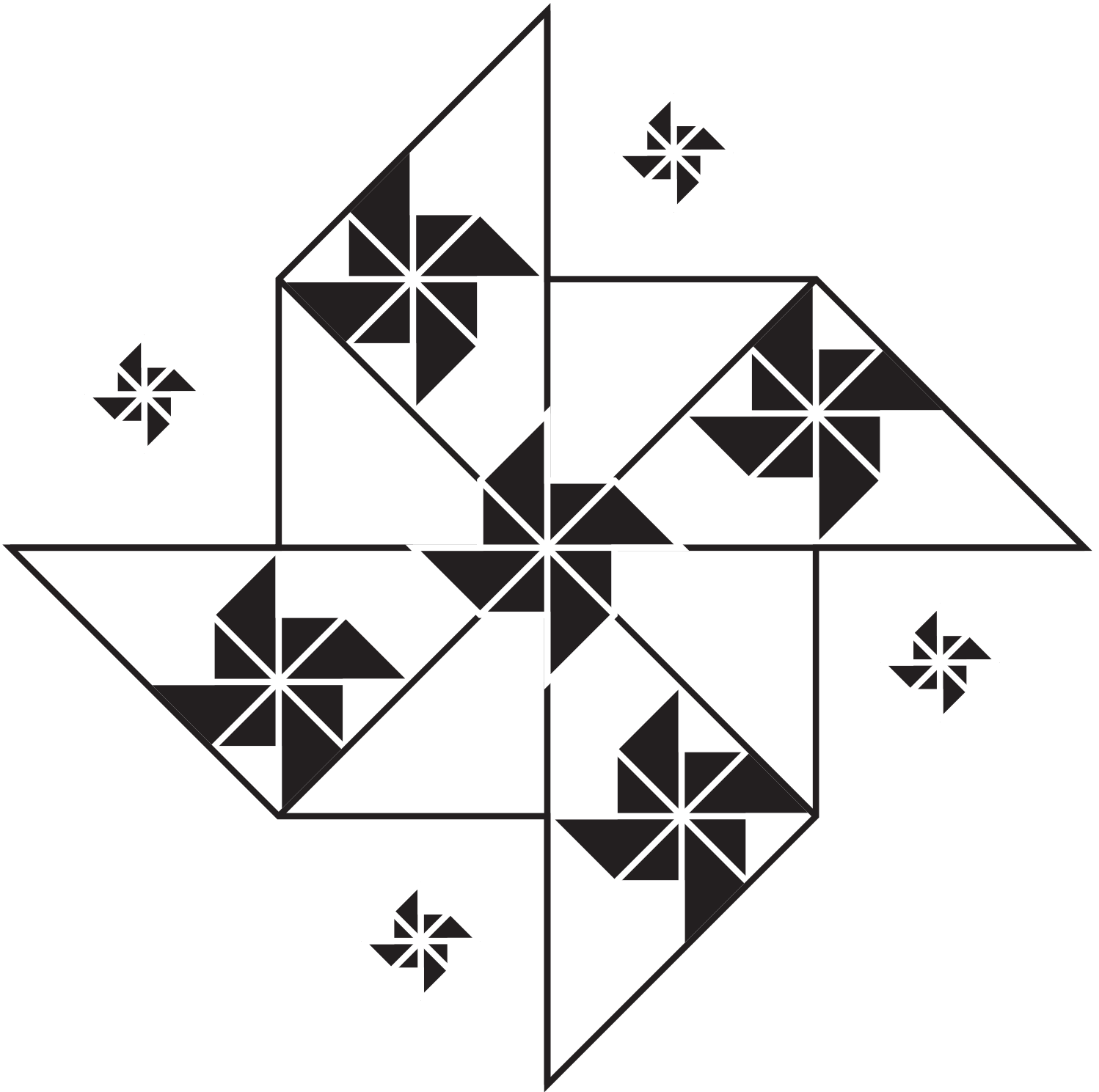
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Pinwheel Coloring Sheet:

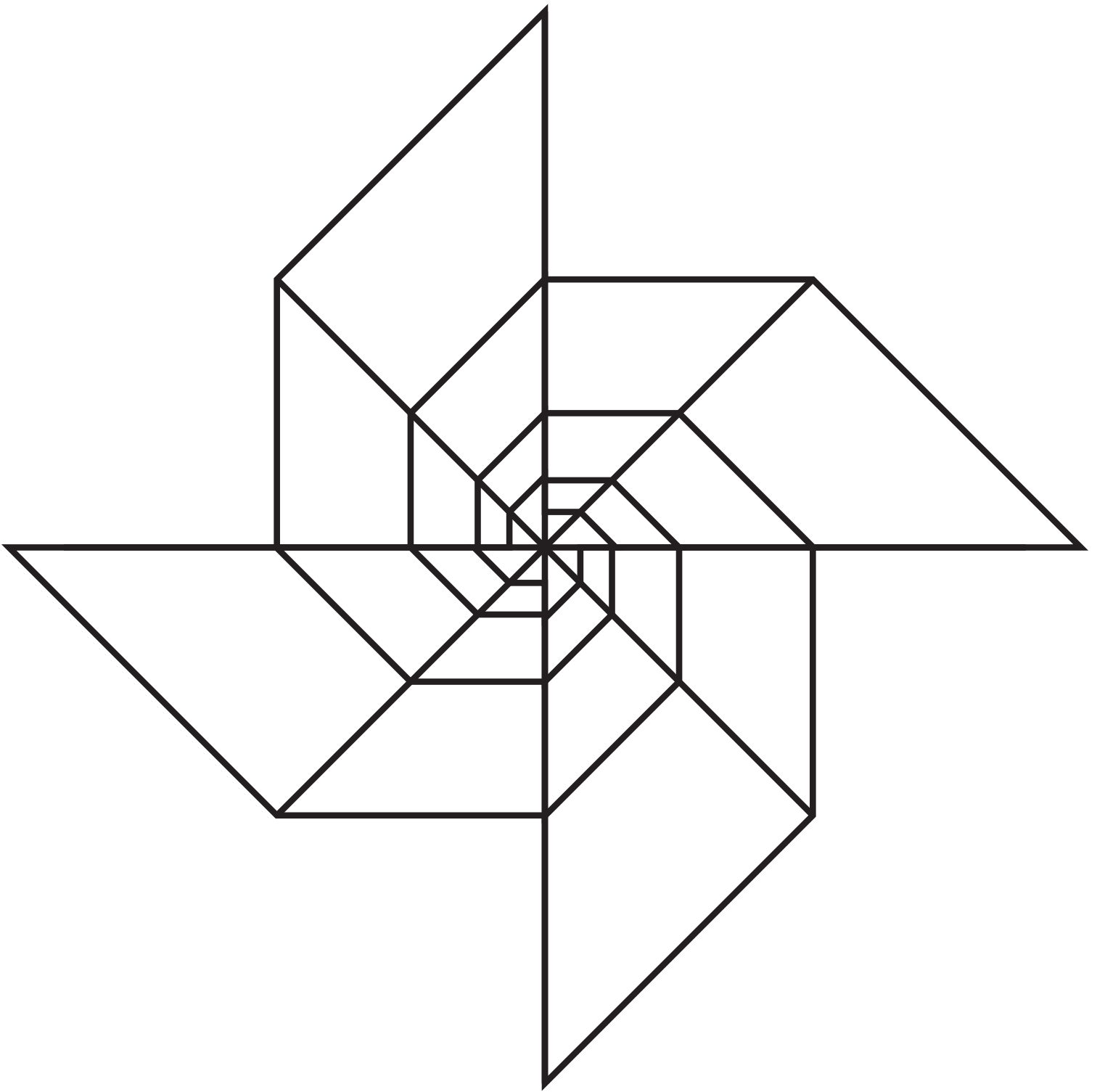
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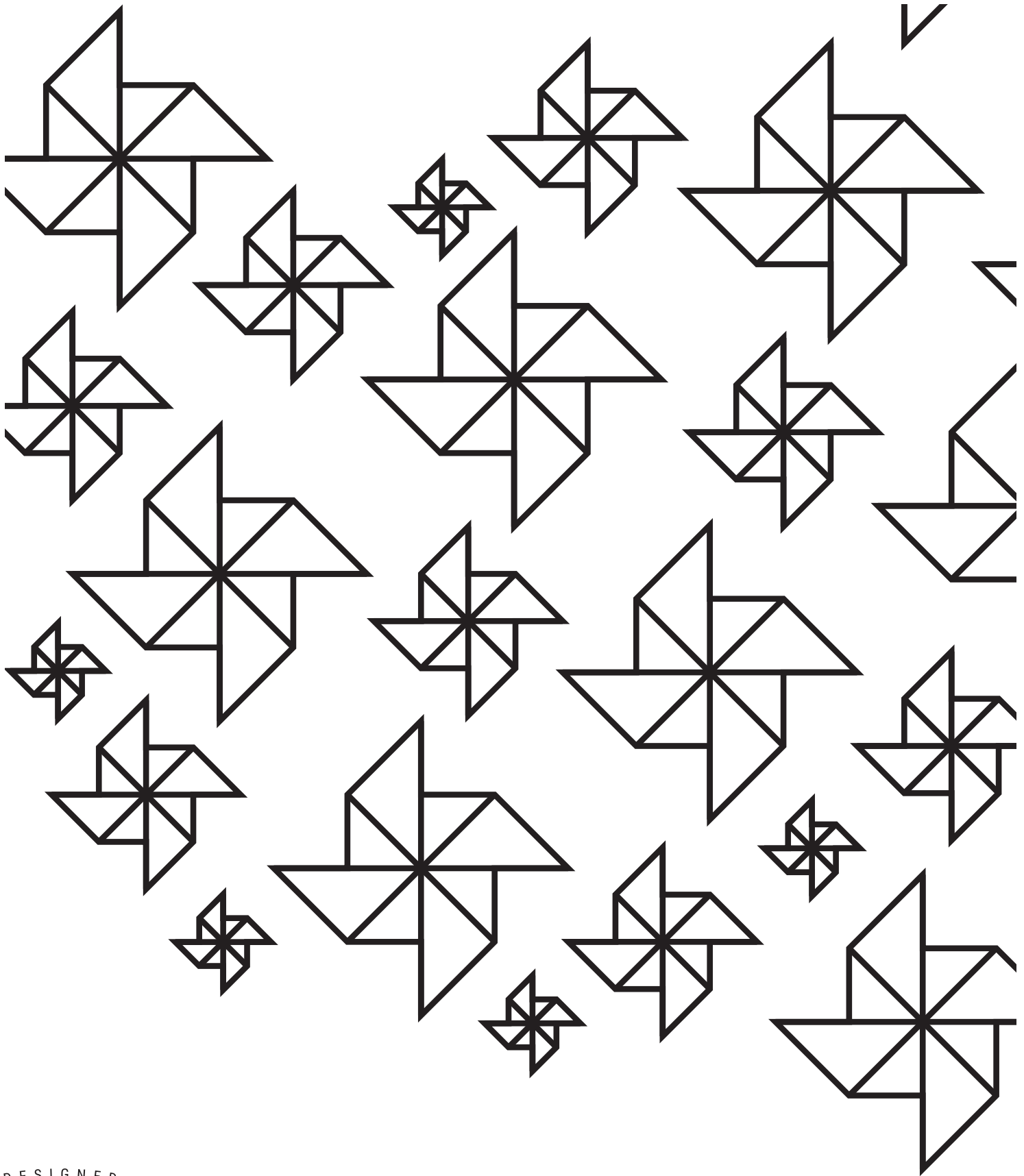
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Pinwheel Coloring Sheet: The Web (*Internet Safety*)

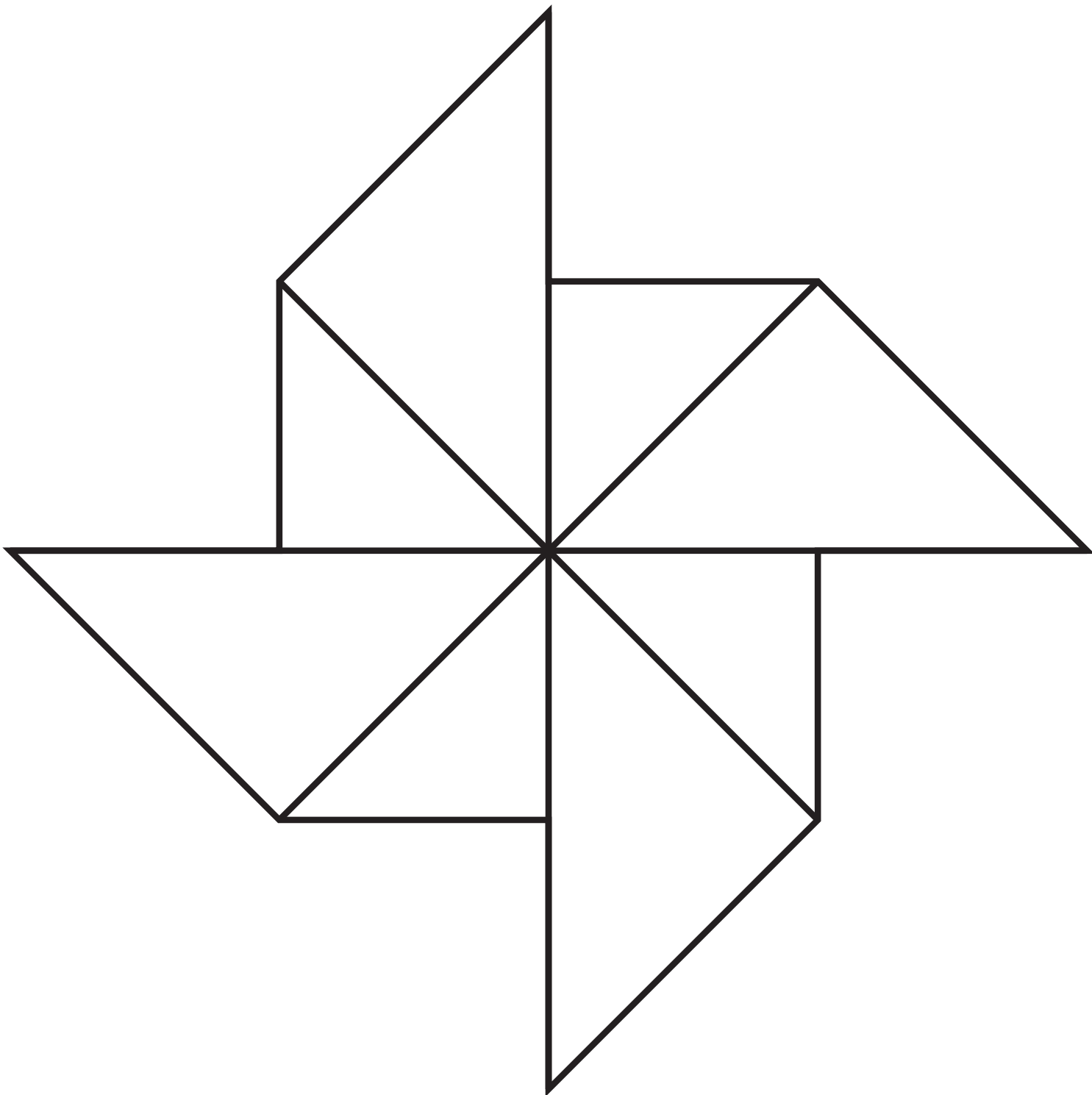
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Pinwheel Coloring Sheet: My Safety Network Activity

A blue pinwheel is the recognized symbol for child abuse prevention. Here's a project you can do with your kids that can serve as a daily reminder to talk to your child about their safety network. Together, fill out the sections of the pinwheel starting with the larger pieces (you don't have to fill them all but try to have at least four) with the name of a person they know and can trust to tell anything to without fear, blame, or shame, and who will always believe them and be there for them no matter what.
