

# Pinwheel Coloring Sheet:



Together, fill out the sections of the pinwheel starting with the larger pieces (you don't have to fill them all but try to have at least four) with the name of a person they know and can trust to tell anything to without fear, blame, or shame, and who will always believe them and be there for them no matter what.
