DIY Pinwheels:

Supplies you'll need:

- Cardstock paper (white, colored or patterned)
- Pencil with eraser
- Needle-nose pliers
- Scissors
- Straight pearl sewing pin

Directions:

1. Print page 2 (on white paper to color your own design or print on colored/patterned paper for finished design).
2. Cut along dotted lines.
3. Use pliers to bend sewing pin creating a 90-degree angle, 1/3 of the length up from the pin's pointed end. [image 1]
4. Fold points to the left of each cut toward the center. [image 2]
5. Hold the folded points in place while you push the pin through the center, be sure to catch all four corners. [image 3]
6. Next, gently guide paper around the bend in pin, sliding the pinwheel out to the pin's pearl end. [image 4]
7. Firmly press the pin's pointed end straight down into the pencil's eraser. [image 5]
8. Your pinwheel is complete – give it a spin!

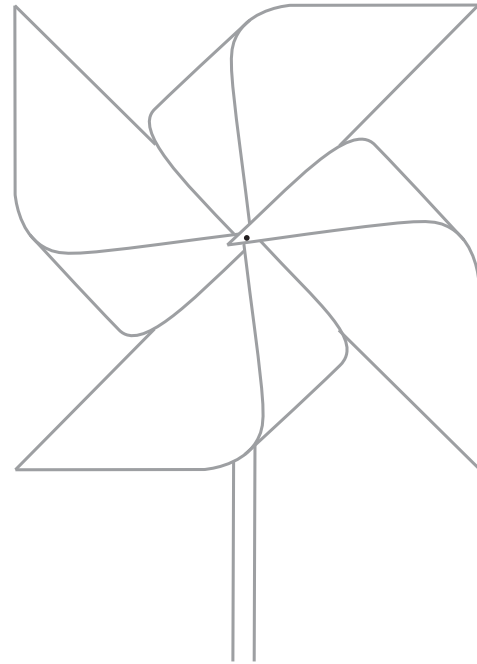
