## Nomenclature of the G7 ALPINE SHELTER





(1) Top loop


4 Door

(2) Cone

(5) Straps

- (3) Vent
- \* Formerly called the "STORM SHELTER"

## **Tie-in point installation**



Install the Sterling XTec cord in the top of the cone. Tie a double fisherman's knot\* to secure the cord.



\*Training from a qualified professional is required to safely perform this step.


3 Stow the ALPINE SHELTER in the stuff sack. Keep the end of the tiein point visible through the closure of the stuff sack to aid setup.

# 1 The ALPINE SHELTER comes with a piece of heat resistant 6 mm Sterling XTec cord (rated to 21 kN).



Seam seal application

1 The fabric of your ALPINE SHELTER is waterproof and breathable. In order for the shelter to be waterproof the seams will need to be treated.







- 3 Apply a thin layer of the included Seam Grip WP on all outside seams highlighted in the illustration below.
- 4 Let the Seam Grip WP dry for 12 hours.



(5) Apply chalk or talc to the treated seams to prevent sticking before repacking your ALPINE SHELTER.

## **Deploying the G7 ALPINE SHELTER**



- 1 Hang the ALPINE SHELTER by attaching the top loop and stuff sack to your anchor point.
- (2) Attach the POD(s) to the tie-in point.



(3) Inflate and level the POD(s). Refer to POD manual for proper leveling configurations.



Deploy the ALPINE SHELTER from its stuff sack. Ensure the tie-in point and attachment of the POD(s) are configured correctly.



5 Only for setup with a single G7 POD. Remove the door by unzipping it on both sides.



6 Connect and adjust the straps under the ALPINE SHELTER to keep it secure.



The ALPINE SHELTER deployed over a single POD.



The ALPINE SHELTER deployed over two PODs setup side by side.



Never anchor yourself to the G7 POD.

You must always remain tied into a belay anchor.

# Stowing and storage



- 1 Detach the POD(s). Stow the ALPINE SHELTER in the stuff sack. Leave the tie-in point visible to aid deployment.
- (2) When not in use, store in a cool dry location away from sunlight. Store loosely in a ventilated box when not in use for prolonged periods.
