Introducing the vibrant first release of our 'Young Art' board book series that showcases the work of young Indigenous artists

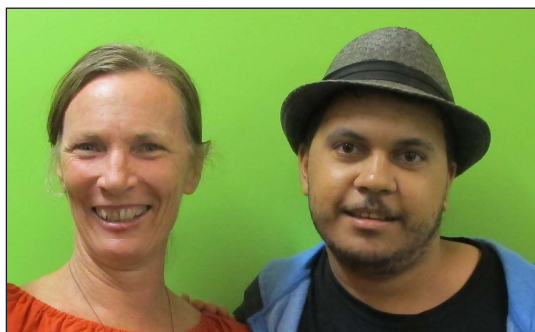
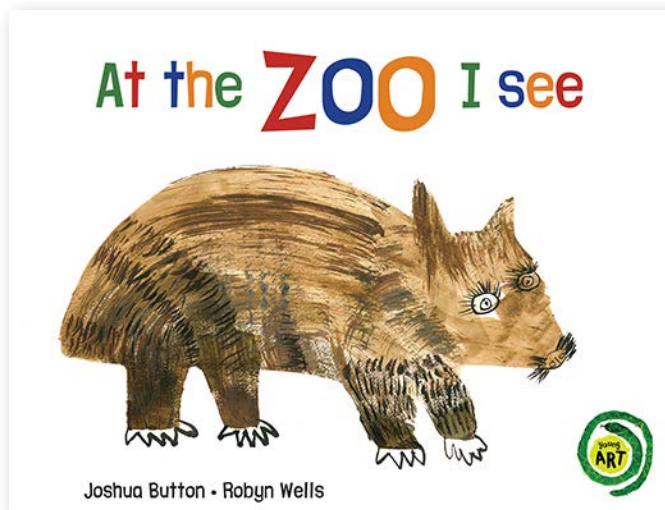
A delightful, classically designed board book for early childhood, *At the Zoo I See* will be sure to enthrall young children and their older readers.

About the creators

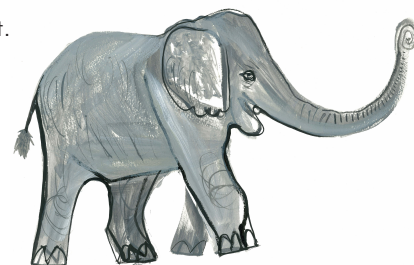
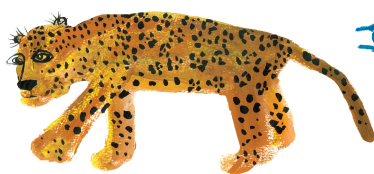
