

# LOG CABIN BLOCK

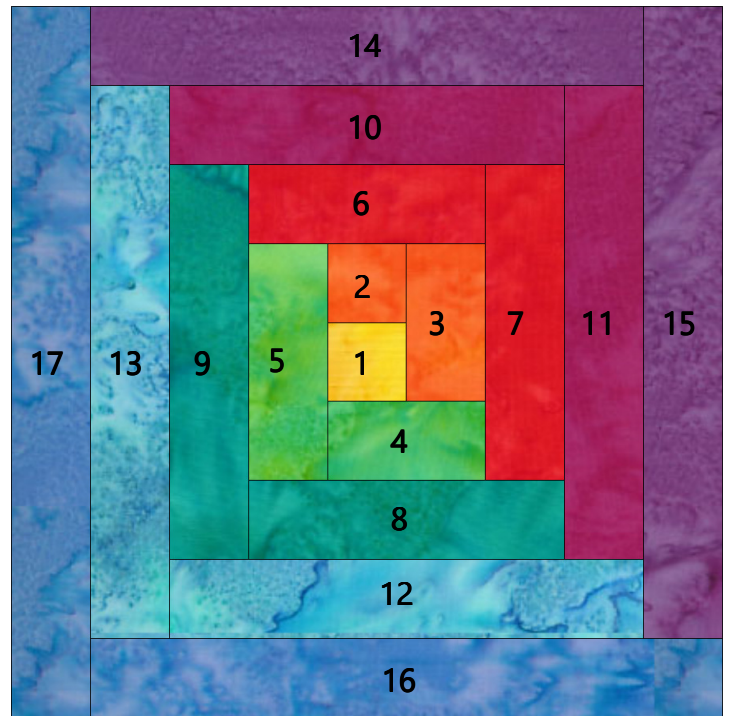
Block size: 9½" square unfinished  
9" square finished

## For a multi coloured block, you need:

1 ½" wide strips in 9 colours

## Cut into:

1	-	1 ½"	square	(yellow)
2	-	1 ½"	square	(orange)
3	-	1 ½"	x 2 ½"	(orange)
4	-	1 ½"	x 2 ½"	(lime)
5	-	1 ½"	x 3 ½"	(lime)
6	-	1 ½"	x 3 ½"	(red)
7	-	1 ½"	x 4 ½"	(red)
8	-	1 ½"	x 4 ½"	(jade)
9	-	1 ½"	x 5 ½"	(jade)
10	-	1 ½"	x 5 ½"	(cerise)
11	-	1 ½"	x 6 ½"	(cerise)
12	-	1 ½"	x 6 ½"	(aqua)
13	-	1 ½"	x 7 ½"	(aqua)
14	-	1 ½"	x 7 ½"	(purple)
15	-	1 ½"	x 8 ½"	(purple)
16	-	1 ½"	x 8 ½"	(blue)
17	-	1 ½"	x 9 ½"	(blue)



## To make the block:

All seams are included and are ¼"

The pieces have been numbered in the order that they are sewn, so start by joining Piece 1 (yellow) to Piece 2 (orange), press the seam towards Piece 2.

With Piece 2 away from you, attach piece 3 (orange), press the seam towards Piece 3.

With Piece 3 away from you, attach piece 4 (lime), press the seam towards Piece 4.

With Piece 4 away from you, attach piece 5 (lime), press the seam towards Piece 5.

Continue in this manner, sewing strips around, until they are all attached, pressing the seams as you go.

This is a delicious block that can be used in so many ways, how many ways can you think of?
