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Welcome to Boarding

Welcome to Terra Nova School!

We thought you might like a few tips about boarding at Terra Nova School.

New to Boarding

Do not worry, we were all new once, but you will soon get used to it. You will be shown around the Boarding House and have a fire practice.

Somebody else will be your "buddy" for the early days to help you around the place. Don't be frightened to ask questions. The staff are kind and will try to help you. Mr Hanrahan is the Head of Boarding and Mrs Staziker, his wife, is the House Parent. His children, Illyria and Bastian, also live in the boarding house and go to Terra Nova School.

There are two matrons, Avril and Sandra, who will help you with laundry, look after your valuables and care for you if you are unwell.

There are several other teachers who help in the Boarding House. Miss Deighton, Miss Bailey, Mrs Capewell, Miss Kellet-Gibson, Miss Ramkelawan, Mr Jackson, Miss Curran and Mr Cusack are all on duty one evening a week, as well as at weekends. The Headmaster, Mr Stewart, also does some duties.

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Daily Routine

The wake up is at 07:00 and we have to report to matron or Mr Hanrahan to check that our dorms are tidy and our uniform is correct by 07:25.

You get credits if you are on time and leave your bed area tidy. Don't forget to change your sheet or duvet on a Friday.

Breakfast is at 07:30. You get a lot of choice and there is always plenty to eat. Don't forget to brush your teeth and collect your bag at 08:15 before going to your form room/ classroom.

Registration is at 08.30. Don't be late!

At the end of the school day there is a snack and after-school clubs. Supper is at 18:00 followed by free time and activities. You can have a drink and a snack before going to the common room or up to dorm from 19:30. Lights out is from 20:15 and the times will be on the wall in your dorm.



Boarding Rules

Most of Boarding House life is about using your common sense. Boarding is fun but you must be sensible too.

Some of the more important rules are as follows:

• You should be quiet in the dorms after lights out until you are woken by a member of staff at 07:00.

• Children are not permitted into any dorm other than their own without permission of the members of staff on duty. Boys are not allowed into the girls' dorms and vice-versa.

• In the boarding area children should move around quietly and without running.

• Bed spaces and clothes should be kept tidy at all times.

• The school does not accept bullying. Any bullying should be reported to the Headmaster, Mr Hanrahan or the duty member of staff so that action can be taken.

• Look after your property. Do not use other people's property without their permission.

• At meal times good table manners are expected. You can talk but shouting is not allowed. When meals are finished, plates and cutlery should be cleared and children should ask for permission to leave the room.

• Boarders must try to keep to the times in the daily routine.

Keeping in Touch

If you want to make a private telephone call use the boarders' phone on the landing. If you want to make any other call you can use the telephone in matron's office with their permission. You will have access to your mobile phones for a short period of time each evening, and these times will be on your dorm wall.

Weekend Boarding Activities

There are lots of clubs and sports that you can do after school and at weekends.

STEAM school will take place every Saturday morning between 09:00 and 12:00. The first term will be structured into two blocks to build a team who will collaborate and enter the Regional First Lego League Tournament:

STEAM - Block I (first Half Term)

Introduction to First Lego League - learning to program the EV3 robots and how to approach the challenges set as part of the first lego league tournament.

Pupils will:

Program the robots to complete fun challenges.

Customise the robots to their own designs.

Create a presentation about their robots and how their robotics team have worked together.

Work through the challenges set by the FLL so that we can get as many tournament points as we can.

*Option 2 - Saturday STEAM School (9.00am – 12 noon), Saturday lunch, Saturday activity, Saturday dinner, evening activity, Sunday breakfast collection at 9.30am = £65

*Option 3 – Friday – Monday, breakfast lunch and dinner, STEAM School, all organised activities = $\pounds 120$





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
