

I used to listen to and play this one over and over. Vibert layers his drums like an absolute champ with a total earworm of a bassline. When the Wu sample comes in I'm fully back to being 17 years old with my Cold Krush Cuts bootleg mixtape on my walkman sitting in my high school parking lot.

Fila Brazillia - A Zed & Two L's

There was a weird period of time where the northern British port city of Hull was an epicenter of the world for this kind of music, thanks to a seminal and somewhat forgotten label called Pork Recordings, run by a mysterious man called Porky, of course. Their flagship act, Fila Brazillia was always a staple in my crates and this is one of their most beautiful joints. Layered synths, a chunky break, exotic chanting samples (always a must), and a drum'n'bass section. It doesn't get better.

Nickodemus feat. Carol C - Cleopatra in NY


Meanwhile in NYC, this curly haired dude named Nickodemus was getting his feet wet in the burgeoning Acid Jazz scene spearheaded by Giant Step, who were crossing the continental divide as a resident at their legendary parties. Nico took the instrumental hip-hop vibes coming out of the UK and merged it with some distinctly NYC near-Eastern vibes creating an entirely new sound to my young ears. Somehow it seems fitting that today we're great friends & business partners, running Wonderwheel Recordings together.

Saru - Something Stronger

One of my original impetuses for starting Bastard Jazz was coming into contact with a group of young artists signed to NYC based Shadow Records via early internet forms of communication (IRC, listservs, usenet groups). The label was trying to jump on this train back then and had been Ninja Tune's exclusive US licensee for a minute, but weren't pressing any vinyl or doing a whole lot of artist development. I "signed" about 3 of their roster under alternate names to Bastard Jazz and pressed up some viny1 for some new cuts they made. One of them was a native Angelino who went by the name Saru (and "Spooky Monkey" on Bastard Jazz) - this was the first track I heard from him and still strikes a chord with me to this day.

Bomb The Bass - Bug Powder Dust (Kruder & Dorfmeister Remix)

It's hard to overstate how important Peter Kruder and Richard Dorfmeister were to this sound. Veering entirely leftward into deep dub territory from their homebase of Vienna, this was one of the standouts on their completely massive K&D Sessions album. Taking the original psych rap vibes of this Justin Warfield spearheaded joint, they injected deep bass & echos upon echos into what would become a certified stoner classic, even with the questionable cheesy lyrics.

I've been sliding down the tax brackets since like 09, but besides that life after DJing is awesome. I skate, I cook, I'm still cute and i have a 4X4 that's always got something wrong with it. I love it all. Some money will come eventually, I've got a couple years grind ahead of me but honestly just about anything is better than having to play Lil Nas X songs for people that don't even like music really.

For now this life seems at least more interesting than navigating the scene in NY again. I like a new adventure; in the end I'm just not that "Jiro" T think

WHAT'S THE SECRET TO GOOD BRISKET?

There's a bunch of shit but the one thing that's universal and not a secret is no matter what you're cooking on (egg, reverse flow, traditional offset), it's all about the trim. Mill Scale, the shop that made my smoker, has been working with Jirby from Goldee's BBQ doing really great YouTubes. He's got a really good trim video and he's busting a lot of the BS myths that Aaron Franklin built his brand around. Jirby rips.

Digitalism In Cairo 12" / White Label 2006

Before there were color variants, we had white labels. When something hot came in, I'd get a call from distributor before it hit the weekly lists. DJs emails would flow in. The crappier the mark on the label the better. This one was especially crappy with its ill-fitting rectangular office sticker. However, if you look close at the sloppy typography, you'll notice that it's actually a nice font, probably Kitsune trying to pose as shabby. I re-listened to this one recently, and it aged fairly well. The Cure original lends it self well to la French chop.

Amy Winehouse - You Know I'm No Good 12" / Universal 2007

Eee-god. I had to go check out the b-side Hot Chip remix of "Rehab", and lordy it's turrrible. This era of remix culture was one of the worst in the history of mankind. Conversely, Ghostface brought it on the remix of "You Know."

Cousin Cole & Pocketknife: Tambourine Dream CD / Self-Rel 2009

This is still one of my all-time favorite mixes we sold at the Lab (you can find it on Soundcloud). While we were all detoxing from a very bad period of music, these guys laid down a sweatery, Bard college radio selection of indies and unexpected classics (I still can't fathom the Neil Young mix). Thankful, cause it introduced me to Iron & Wine, Beirut, The Duke Spirit, Panda Bear, etc.

Kid Cudi: Day N Nite 12" / Fool's Gold Records 2009

I remember how unmoved I was when we first got this in. I liked the Dust artwork more than the song. I got it all wrong. Watching this track grow from underground 12" to worldwide phenomenon was eye-opening. Seeing how major labels could swoop in and amplify/monetize just one track made our site feel really small. OG Fool's Gold pressings seem to be in demand.

Curtis Vodka: The Yeti Bounce 12" / Flamin' Hotz 2006

This came out around the peak of Hollerboard era. Curtis was from Anchorage and made a name presenting his works to the board. You could really level up by jumping from the message boards to pressed wax. Philly's Flamin Hotz capitalized on this micro-phenomenon for a couple years before people got sick of the sing-sing loop.

Digital Underground Sex Packets (1990)



1990 seems so far away. This was an important record back then and anything that had "sex" in the title was so edgy. Add black dudes wearing pimp gear and fake noses and it was suburban infiltration by Suzuki Samurai. 13 year olds grinded (the vertical dry hump) to "Humpty Dance" at school dances. Older kids told us that "Sex Packets" made you ejaculate without humping (or watching late night Skinamax at sleepovers). "Doowutchyalike" wasn't a bad follow-up and got it into the midwest. "Freaks of The Industry" still one of the baddeest album-only cuts in history (so much finesse). In retrospect, this debut from the Oakland crew led by Shock-G / Humpty is much better than I remember. Going against the times, the songs here were all about musical restraint and control. They weren't blasting 50 rhymes per bar or looking for the loudest horn loop, plus they had Pac as a back up dancer. With great album cuts like "Packet Man" and "Sex Packets," and "Freaks," you can actually listen from beginning to end. 14 tracks in all, recommended.
