





A lot of us saw it coming but Covid put the demise into overdrive. For a long time people who were either too lazy or autistic to play the hustle game could still earn a living as a DJ. Not anymore.

Don't get it twisted, I am not especially sentimental. I don't blame some failing of the culture or the lameness of millennial strivers. The largest generation in American history came of age at the exact moment that advances in technology, initially those little lines in the middle of Serato, cut the learning curve from a staggering mountain to a grassy knoll. There are 80 million people under 40 in America. The lowered barrier for entry and sheer numbers means a lot of fucking DJs.

Sure there are more clubs but not that many more. As we begin to re-open, whatever venues survive or rise from the ashes will absolutely not be able and/or willing to pay DJs a living wage. And why should they when DJ so and so will do it for 200 dollars? DJ so and so isn't a scab, they are just navigating the saturated market. So the hustlers will hustle and the producers will survive and those imbued with both will prosper. But the weirdos? It doesn't look good.

Yes there will be exceptions to the rule, but I just can't imagine a world where many DJs who don't produce music or zealously promote themselves can still earn a good living as a DJ. Barely anyone was doing it before, now it seems impossible.

And as I watch the rats scurry, jockeying their mortifying Twitch streams, praying they don't drown before a vaccine arrives, I am happy. Not that I want people to struggle or suffer but I am happy to be set free from the work, the competition and the bondage of the easy money teet. Now I can decide to strive in DJing or treat it like a hobby, an artistic practice without expectations.

INSIGNIFICANT RECORDS THAT CHANGED THE COURSE OF LAB HISTORY

Artist Unknown: Bridge Is Over 12" (Green Label) Bozo Meko Records 1991 - ?

So much meat here, this is the NYC DJ 101. I never knew DJs who actually played the A-side "Bridge Is Over" even though NYC was in a golden-era hip-hop headlock (mid-90s). DJs would use the "Spread Love" Remix like an early version of an AV8 transition break. The 12" gained a 2nd life when DJs (Rich Medina, Language come to mind) started playing the edit of "Brazilian Rhyme" at downtown hip-hop parties (dgmw, this edit was always played before, just not in the TTL EV radius). Shortly after, this became one of our bestselling 12"s of all time and transitioned us into a new record section of NYC classic white labels, disco 12"s (dollar bin for the longest time), and eventually edits by Norwegians. Shout out to George T for the supply. If you want to get extra nerdus, we can exchange notes about production credits (Mark The 45 King?), early pressing vs. late pressings, label variations, and that Mandrill track we didn't even touch upon.
