SAILING SHIPS – NOTEBOOKING PAGES

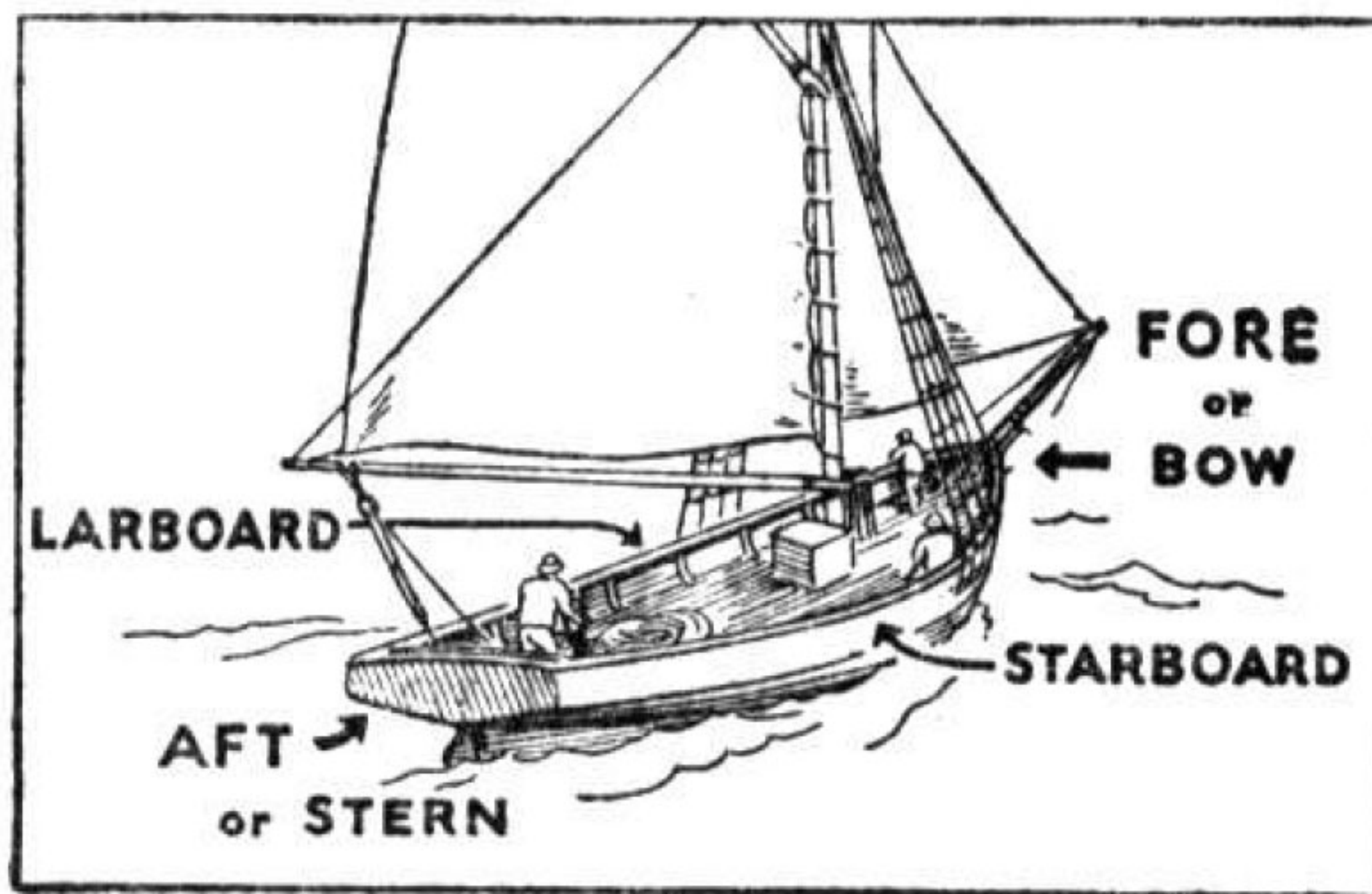
