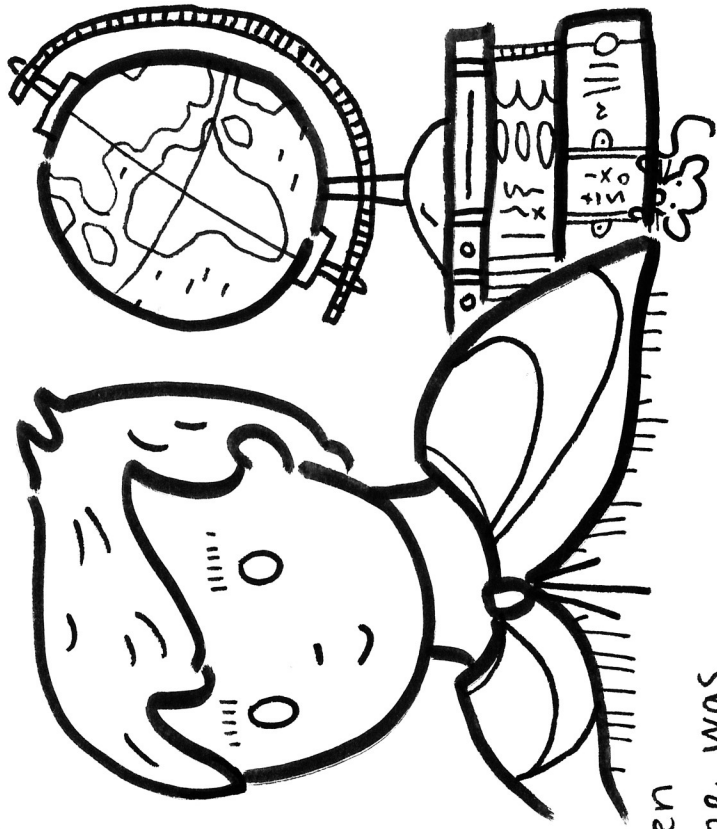

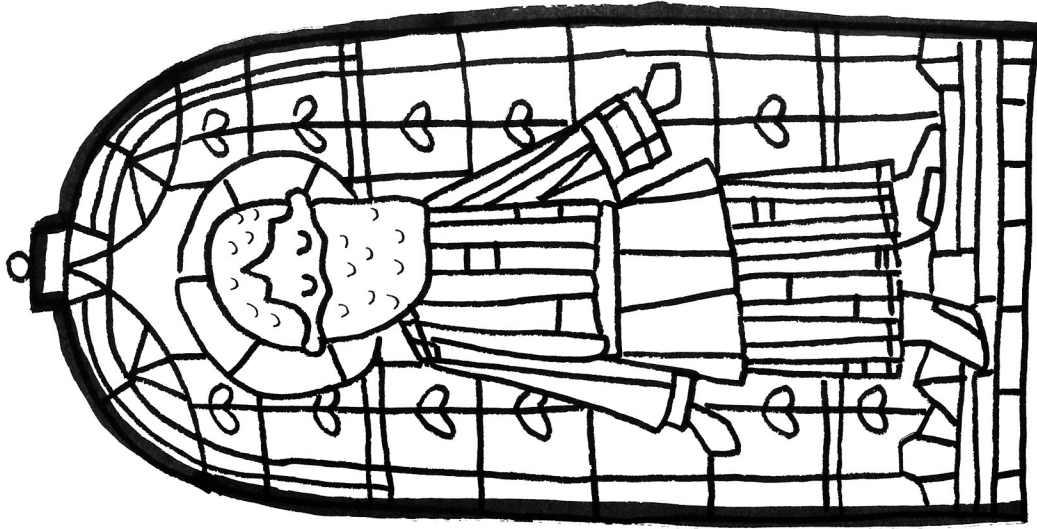
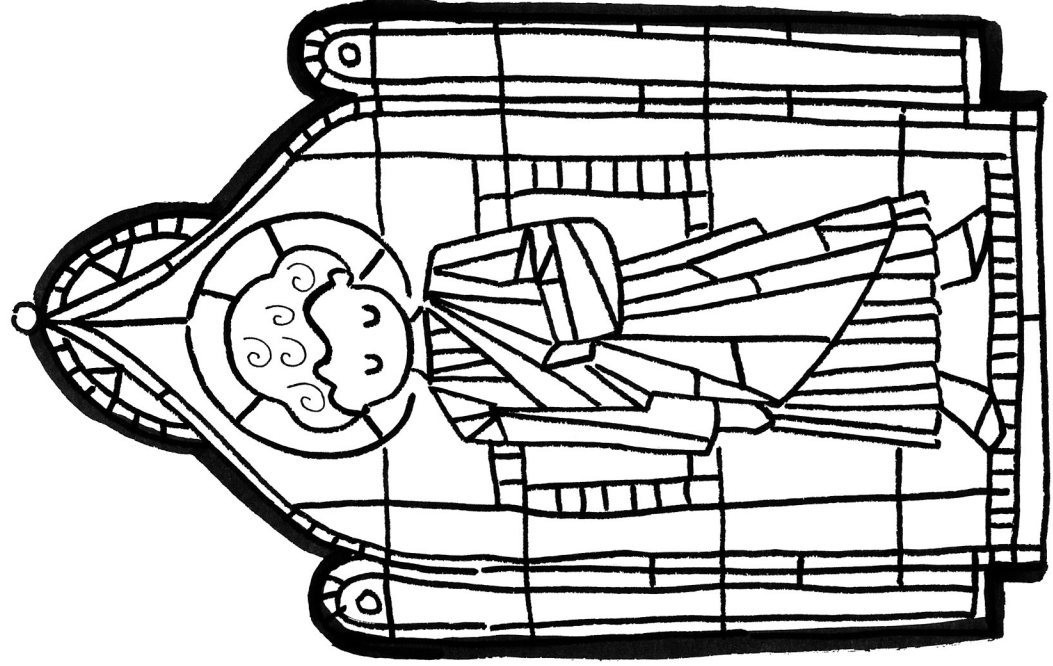




ST. ROSE OF LIMA

 September 29th: Angels appear frequently in the scriptures, but these are the only ones called by name.





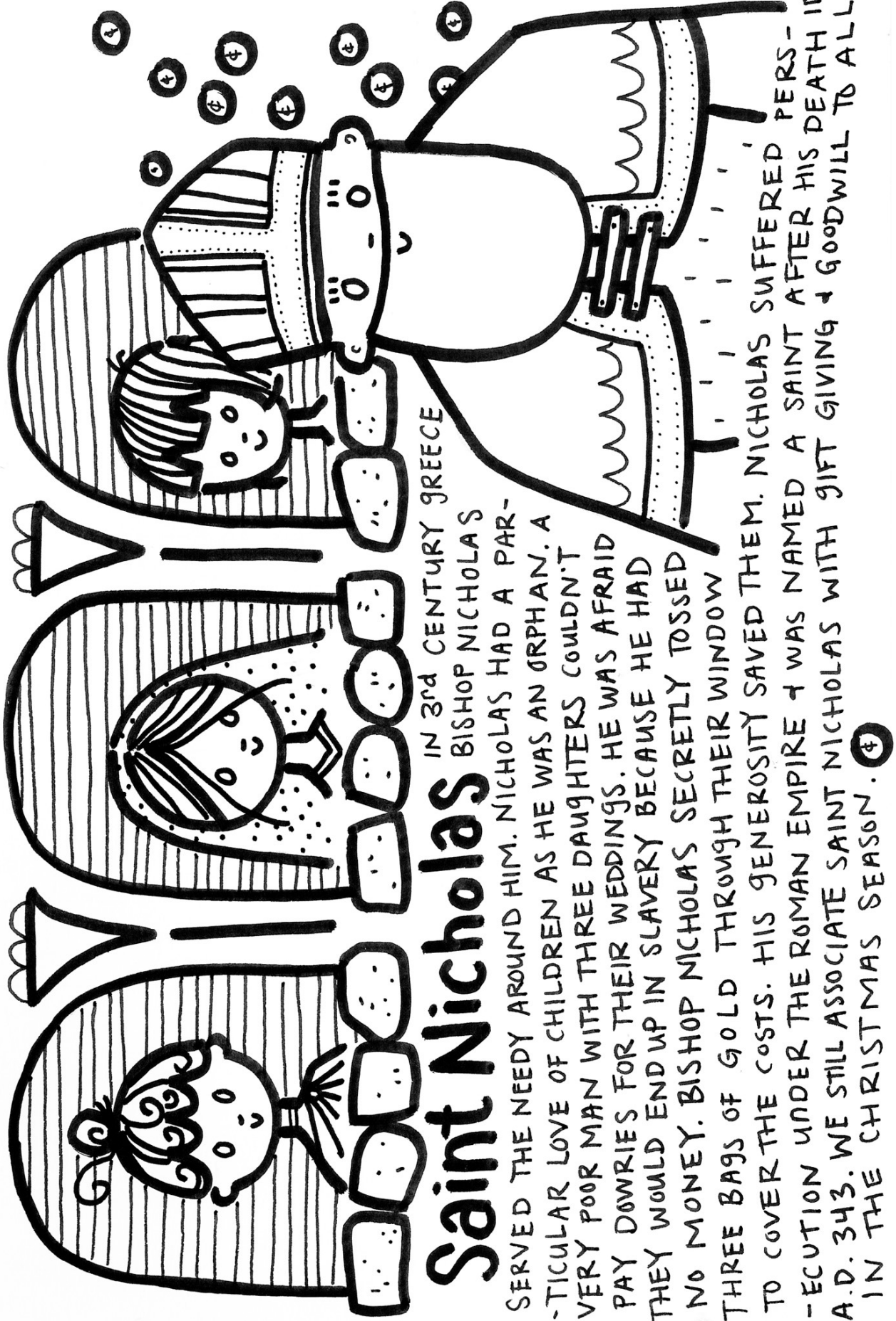
ST. FRANCIS of Assisi is the patron saint of ANIMALS. October 4th.

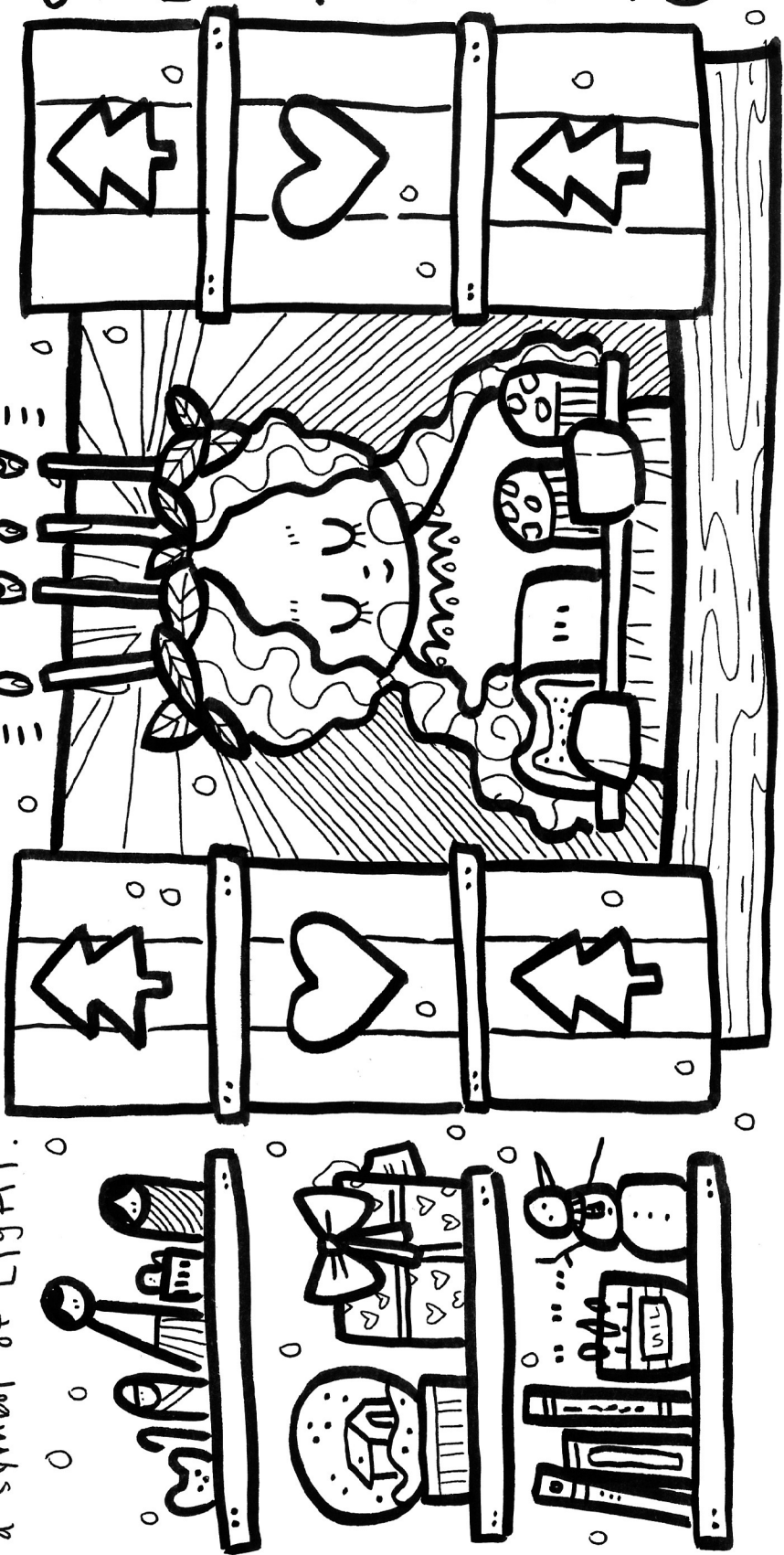


A HOLY ANGEL GAVE CECILIA A CROWN
