These can also be called "Who Am I" stories. They introduce children to a lot of information about various animals and plants, provide a background for later classification work. They also provide a fun way to practice reading comprehension and thinking skills. They are also great for initiating discussion or inspiring further research.

Activity 1

The simplest activity would be to match the animal or plant picture with the name of the animal or plant. This is a good opportunity to introduce children to plants and animals they are not that familiar with. This material can be used over and over. A few cards can be introduced each week over the course of the year.

Activity 2

After laying out all the photographs an adult can read the description from one text card. The child can guess which animal or plant is being described. Alternatively, the student can read the text cards and work independently.

Activity 3

The child can draw pictures and write their own little story about the same or about different plants or animals.

Activity 4

Animal or plant magazines can be cut up to make cards, booklets and charts.

Activity 5

Research and make sets of cards of plants and animals that live in the same continent. All seven continents can be done in this manner.


