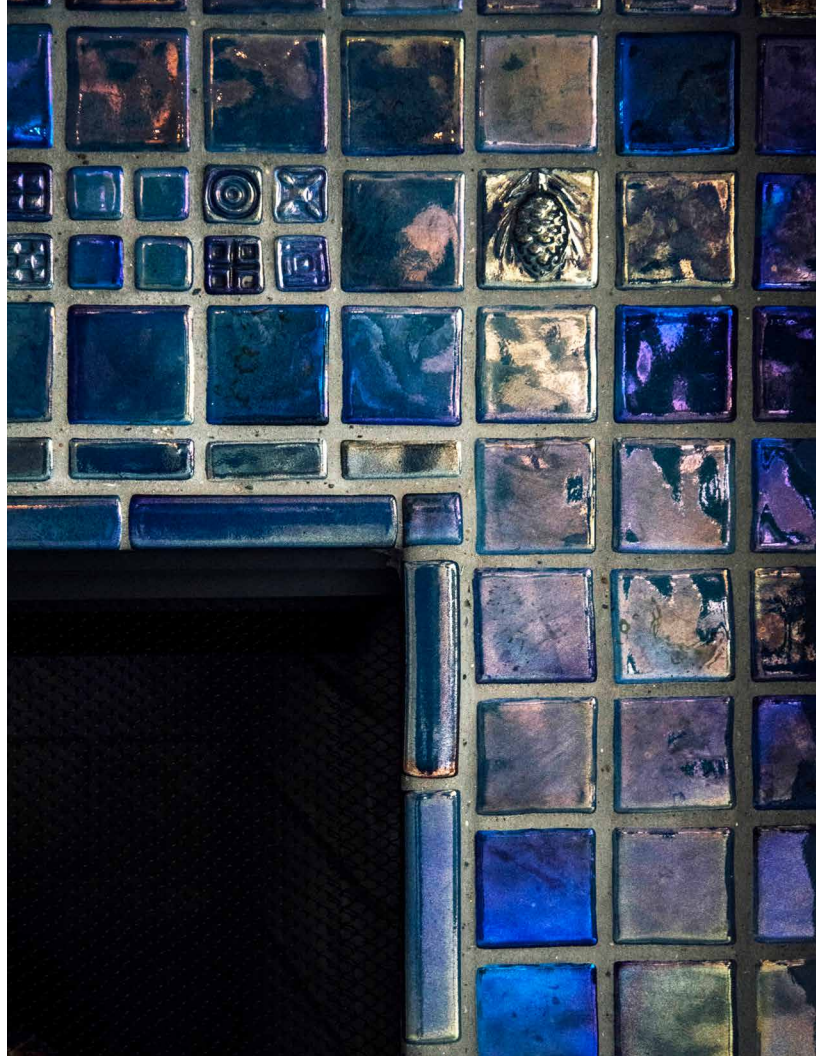

PEWABIC POTTERY
In 1870 Henry Davenport Pewabic
established the Pewabic Pottery in
Cleveland, Ohio. The pottery was
located in the building which was
designed by the architect John C.
Carr. The pottery was the first
of its kind in the United States
and was the first to produce
artistic pottery. The pottery was
closed in 1910 and the building
was used as a school for the
Cleveland School of Art. The
building was restored in 1970
and is now a museum of
artistic pottery.

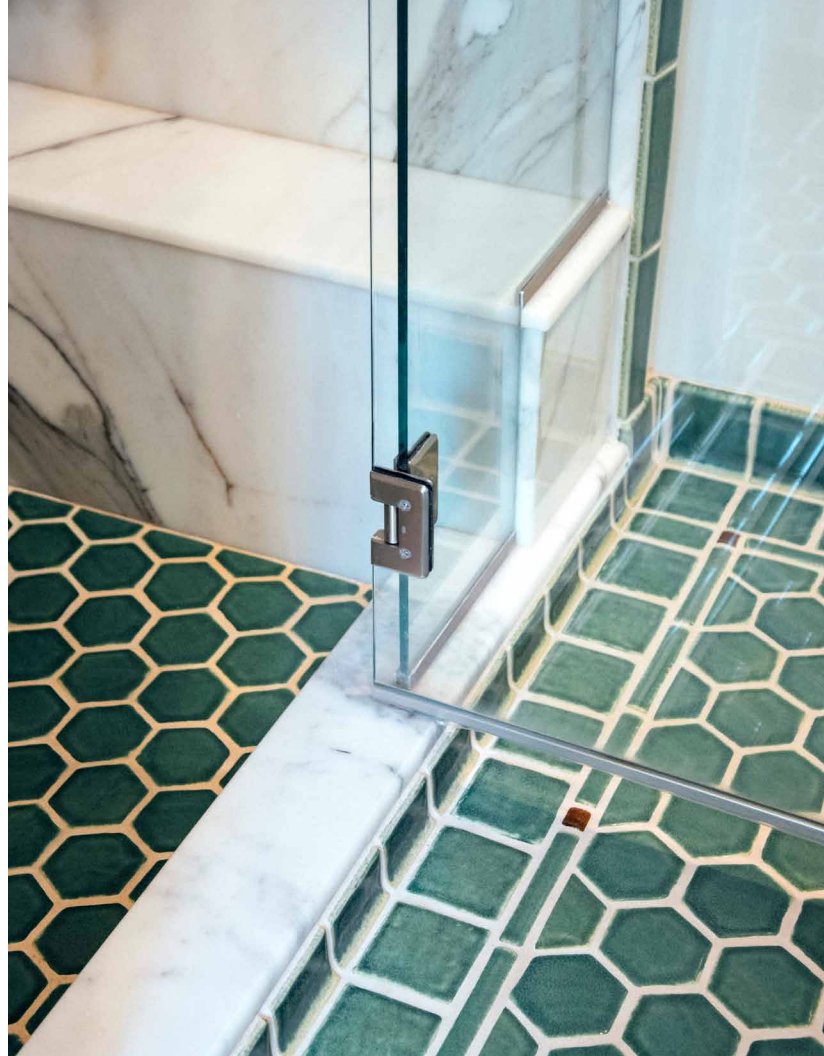

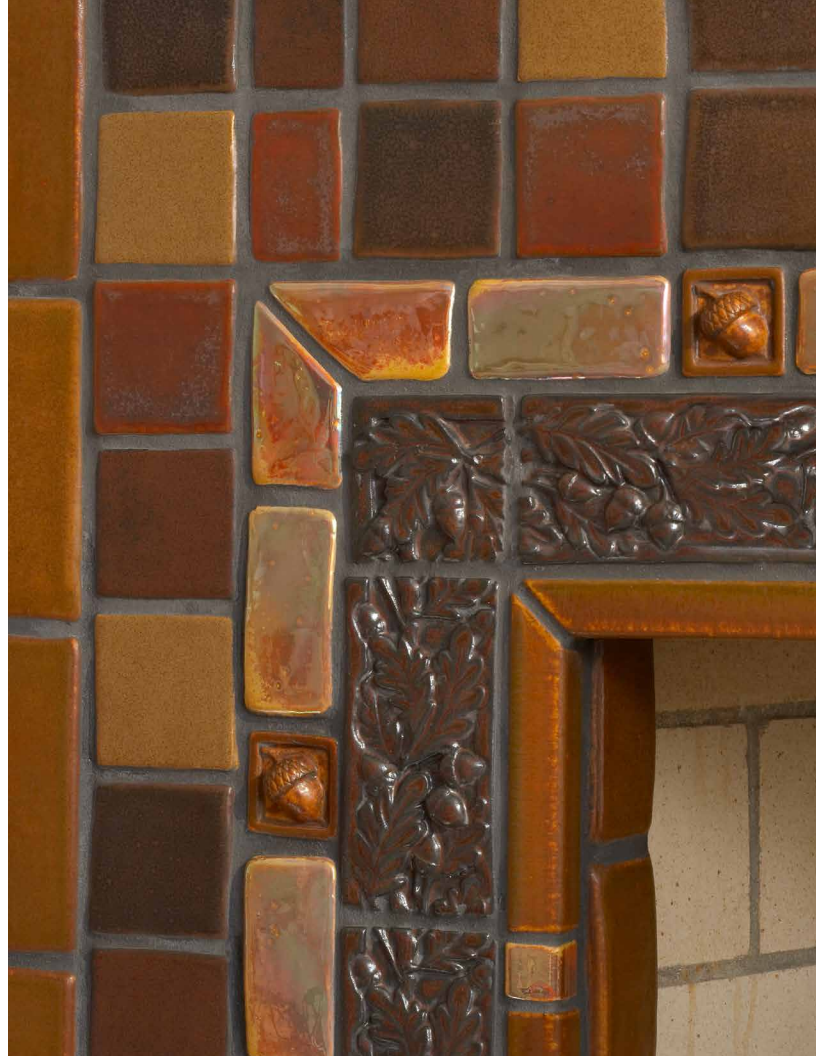

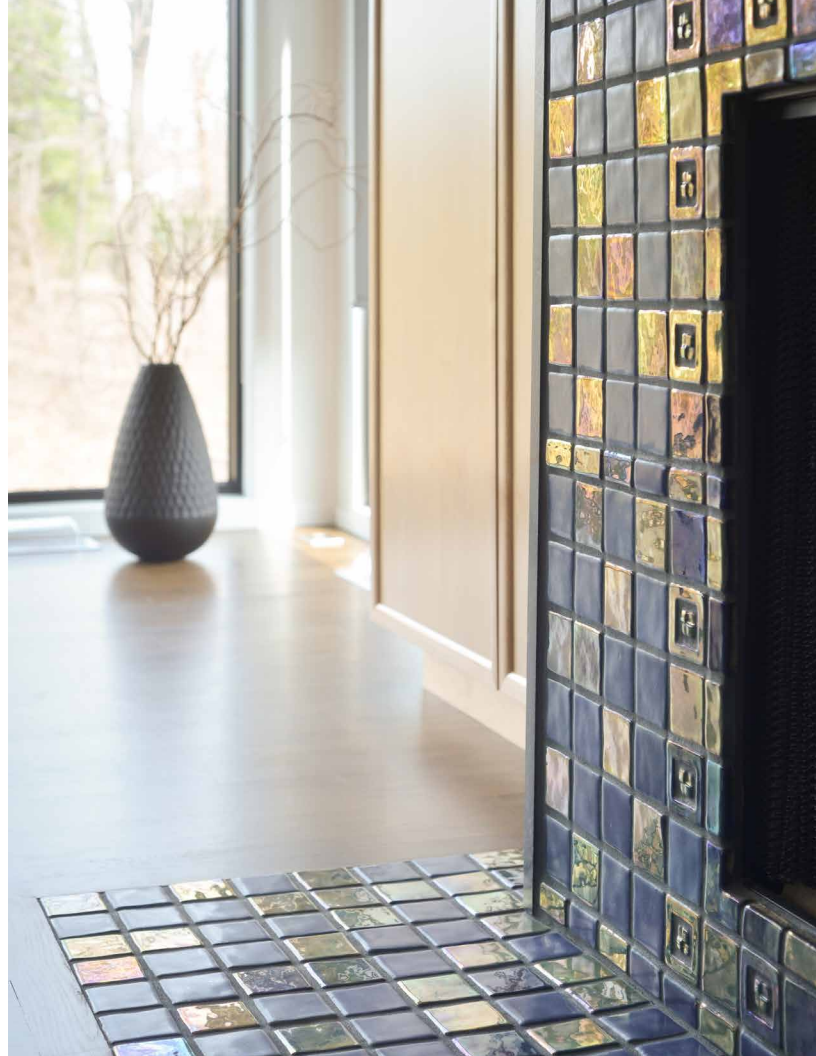
