## **Rosie Takes Jumpstart to Heart**

**ROSIE MACLENNAN** Jumpstart Ambassador since 2013

Three-time Olympian, two-time Olympic gold medal winner and Team Canada Flag Bearer at the 2016 Rio Olympics, Rosie MacLennan understands the role sports can play in shaping youth into strong, confident young people.

In an interview at the end of the Rio Opening Ceremonies, she told the CBC's Scott Russell that she would be making a donation to Jumpstart. It is an "organization," she said, "close to my heart" because all kids inspired by the Rio Olympics "should have the chance to play."

Her very public declaration before a national audience fulfilled a commitment she had made to herself during a difficult period of training the year previous. If she made it to Rio, she vowed, she would gift Jumpstart the money she had saved from winning the trampoline event at the London Olympics in 2012. Not only did she make it but she won a second consecutive gold.

Rosie MacLennan is an inspiration to kids and to all of us at Jumpstart who share her belief in the power of sport.

Our stores support Jumpstart at all times but there's one time when they really step it up. Every year, stores in our Canadian Tire, Sport Chek, Mark's and Gas+ family participate in Jumpstart Month, a monthlong fundraising celebration held in communities across Canada. Stores host events from BBQs to sport demos and play days. Customers, friends and neighbours are invited and encouraged to donate to the Jumpstart cause.

In 2016, our stores raised more than \$1.9 million nationally during Jumpstart Month. As is our promise, every penny donated was directed towards supporting kids in the very communities where the donation was made. As a result, more local kids got off the sidelines and into the game!



## Bilan

### IN THE SWIM

Jumpstart partners with local organizations like the Boys and Girls Club of Ottawa to make sure that kids really get in the swim of things.

The second-youngest child in a single-parent family of eight, 17-year-old Bilan has been participating in the club's Jumpstart-supported swimming program from an early age. From a fun-loving member of what the kids call "the swim team," she graduated to become a dedicated swimmer who earned her lifequard qualification and assumed a leadership role. "Now," she says, "instead of being a swim club member, I'm running the whole thing."

Bilan has no plans to stop. With the money she's saving from her lifeguarding duties, she's hoping to pursue a postsecondary education. "I really like the medical aspect of being a lifeguard, so I want to put those things together and become a nurse."

### **KICKS ARE** FOR KIDS

In a Montreal neighbourhood where gang life is often the only alternative to the realities of poverty and exclusion, Jumpstart has partnered with local police to create a thriving initiative for vouth sports. Le Club de L'Espoir (The Hope Club).

This Jumpstart-supported initiative has been helping kids like Annie develop physical and interpersonal skills that help change the trajectory of their lives. An enthusiastic member of the club's kickboxing program for the past four years, Annie recently earned her brown belt. As well as providing physical benefits, the program offers kids like Annie leadership opportunities through employment at the summer camp.

Le Club de L'Espoir has helped transform the relationship between individual police (who often volunteer at the club) and local youth. The result is a happier, safer and more hopeful neighbourhood.




