


## Bench Fabric Replacement

## Wood Plug Removal

Tools Required: Screw and Screwdriver

- 1. Insert a wood screw into the <u>centre</u> of the wood plug. The screw will hit the head of the screw under the wood plug.
- 2. Continuing to drive the screw in will cause the wood plug to pull out.
- 3. Remove the plug from the screw to re-use the screw. Discard the damaged plug.



Upholstered Back Replacement Tools Required: #2 Robertson or Phillips Screwdriver, hammer

- 2. Remove the 4 wood plugs following the instructions above above.
- 3. Note the position of the fabric relative to the back legs fabric slightly above the wood leg.
- 4. Remove the 4 wood screws and the upholstered back.
- 5. Install the new upholstered back, placing in the same position as the original, centred front to back on the wood leg.
- 6. Install the new wood plugs, hammer gently until flush with the wood surface.

## Upholstered Seat Replacement Tools Required: #2 Robertson or Phillips Screwdriver

- 1. Turn the item upside down.
- 2. Remove the 4 corner wood screws (plus centre screws on benches) and the upholstered seat. (Only remove screws that hold the seat)
- 3. Install the new seat, centred front to back (the wood base of the seat will be slightly inside both the front & the back rail.

Hinged Upholstered Seat Replacement Tools Required: #1 Robertson Screwdriver

- 1. Remove all but 2 of the screws on the seat hinge.
- 2. Mark the outline of the hinge and a few of the screw holes on the existing seat.
- 3. Remove the remaining screws.
- 4. Measure and transfer these marks to the new seat in order to position the seat correctly.
- 5. Position the new seat against the hinge and reinstall the screws.
- Install the new safety strap (models 3104, 3105, 3106 and 3107 only)
