
A snow stopping scene with Deluxe Materials Shovelled Snow

There are many snow systems around in the market. However the difference between a good scene and a dramatic one is the realism that can be created with attention to detail. The simulation of drifted, piled and shovelled snow that will even retain tyre and track impression has remained a problem until now. Enter Scenic Shovelled Snow. This novel type of snow can also be mixed by hand with Speed Bond glue to form snowballs and snowmen!






















- **2.** Sprinkle the ground scatter.
- **3.** The model completed before application of the snow.
- **4.** First apply Scenic Spray to the entire scene, This has a gentle spray action and like Scatter Grip dries tacky so it will bond snow on the branches.
- **5.** First and second applications of Scenic Snowflakes as a base cover.
- **6.** Spray again with a second coat of Scenic Spray and then Scenic Snow flakes.
- 7. Add Shovelled Snow with a spatula or similar.
- Glue the Shovelled Snow with Speedbond PVA using pipette.
- **9.** Adding more Shovelled Snow for bigger heaps.
- 10. Adding more Shovelled Snow but showing the effect of snow by the track after a snow plough had been along.
- **11.** Same techniques used when adding Shovelled Snow to a bulldozer clearing the road.
- 12. Rescuing stranded vehicle in Shovelled Snow!
