The kitchen was small and cramped. Because it was closed off with a separate dining room, limited space was available.

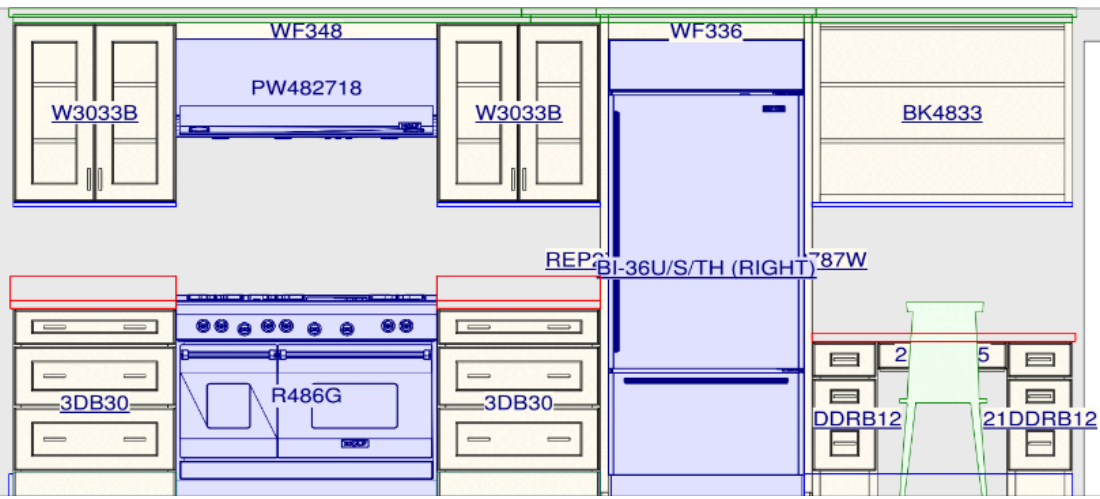


AFTER
