# Jeweled Baubles



Bright circles add so much fun to this design! Create finished-edge circles with fusible interfacing, or use fusible web for raw edge appliqué. Spice them up using a 60° equilateral triangle ruler to make kaleidoscope circles. Subscribe to my newsletter at kariejewell.com for a tutorial on this fun method!

Create finished-edge circles with fusible interfacing, or use fusible web for raw edge appliqué.

#### TIPS:

Plan your small circles first, then match them to their backgrounds. Then choose fabrics for the large circles.

For raw-edge appliqué, iron fusible web to the wrong side of the fabric before cutting your circles.

## Materials:

Circles & Squares - Assorted fabrics, the more variety the better

Cornerstones & Binding - 1 ½ yards

Background - 3 ½ yards

Circles:

Finished-Edge - 4 yards Sulky® Soft n' Sheer™ Extra or any lightweight fusible interfacing (20" wide)

Raw-Edge Appliqué - 6 yards fusible web (12" wide)

Sulky® Invisible Polyester Thread

## Cut:

### **Cornerstones & Binding**

6 – 3 ½" x WOF

Sub-cut into  $71 - 3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

7 – 2.5" x WOF (binding)

### Background

 $17 - 6 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF (width of fabric)

42 - 6 ½" x 6 ½"

120 - 6 ½" x 3 ½"

#### **Prints**

 $30-6\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6  $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Use a variety - the small circles will be appliquéd to these

# Cut, cont'd:

Circles - (For kaleidoscope instructions, sign up here.)

### Finished Edge Circles

From fabric and interfacing:

30 - 4 ½" circles

42 - 6" circles

### Raw Edge Circles

From fabric and fusible web:

30 - 4 ½"x 4 ½" squares

42 - 6" x 6" square

# Assembly:

### **Finished Edge Circles**

- 1. Sew Sulky® Soft n' Sheer™ Extra or any lightweight fusible interfacing to the back of all circles using a ¼" seam allowance.
- 2. Cut a slit in the fusible interfacing and turn circle right side out.
- 3. Smooth circle edges with a pointed tool.

### **OR**

### **Raw Edge Circles**

- 1. Fuse web to the wrong side of fabric squares.
- 2. Cut 4" circles from 4 ½"x 4 ½" squares.
- 3. Cut 5 ½" x 5 ½" circles from 6"x 6" squares.

### Then continue...

- 4. Iron circles to the center of each 6 ½" square, placing large circles on the background fabric and small circles on coordinating fabrics.
- 5. Stitch circles in place with Sulky <sup>®</sup> Invisible Polyester thread.
- 6. Lay out quilt, on point, according to diagram on page 5, with sashing and cornerstones. The full sized blocks on the edges will be trimmed off after assembly is complete.
- 7. Sew together in rows. Press seams towards sashing (rows shown in red, below)
- 8. Sew rows together. Press seams towards sashing.
- Use a ruler and marking utensil to mark 1/8" from where the seams intersect along the outer edge. Use a large square ruler to mark the corners so they are squared properly.
- 10. Shorten stitch length to 1.5 and sew a stay stitch on the line drawn.
- 11. Trim edges to ¼" from seam intersections (the stay stitch will prevent the edges from stretching).
- **12.** Quilt as desired.
- 13. Sew binding strips end to end. Trim and press in half lengthwise.
- 14. Sew binding to the front of quilt with 1/4" seam allowance and hand stitch to the back of quilt.
