

Sencilla

SIZE

86" long x 8½" wide, before fringe

MATERIALS

Manos del Uruguay FINO (70% extrafine merino, 30% silk; approx. 100g/490 yds), I sk plus I mini-skein set. Shown in 401 Corsage (MC) with FM09 Irene (CCI-CC5).

US 5/3.75mm circular ndl 29" or longer, or size to obtain gauge

Crochet hook, USF/3.75mm

GAUGE

22 sts and 48 rows = 4" in Garter Stitch (knit all stitches every row)

NOTES

- I. Scarf in photograph is knitted in Twisted Garter Stitch (knit each stitch through back of loop), which may give the fabric a slightly sheerer look. Knitter's choice! Just be sure you use a needle size that gives the stated gauge.
- 2. Circular needle is used to accommodate large number of sts. Do not join; work back and forth in rows.

ABBREVIATIONS

CC: contrast color

CO: cast on

k: knit

MC: main color ndl: needle RS: right side st(s): stitch(es)

WS: wrong side

STITCH GUIDE

Stripe Pattern (over any number of sts)

Rows I and 2: With MC, knit. At end of Row 2, break yarn, leaving 4½" tail.

Rows 3 and 4: With CCI, knit. At end of Row 4, break yarn, leaving 4½" tail.

Rows 5 and 6: As rows 1 and 2.

Rows 7 and 8: With CC2, knit. At end of Row 8, break yarn, leaving 4½" tail.

Rows 9 and 10: As rows 1 and 2.

Rows 11 and 12: With CC3, knit. At end of Row 12, break yarn, leaving 4½" tail.

Rows 13 and 14: As rows 1 and 2.

Rows 15 and 16: With CC4, knit. At end of Row 16, break yarn, leaving 4½" tail.

Rows 17 and 18: As rows 1 and 2.

Rows 19 and 20: With CC5, knit. At end of Row 20, break yarn, leaving 4½" tail.

Repeat rows I - 20 for Stripe Pattern.

INSTRUCTIONS

Using MC, CO 475 sts. Work rows I-20 of Stripe Pattern 5 times. Using MC, knit two rows; do not break yarn. Bind off knitwise.

FINISHING

Steam-block body of scarf lightly, avoiding the yarn tails.

Fringe: Cut 10" lengths of yarn as follows:

MC: 54 strands

CCI-5: 40 strands each

Use 3 strands of fringe for each CC stripe and 2 strands (I MC and I CC) for each MC stripe. (Or just cut the remaining yarn into 10" lengths and distribute them however you like.) To attach fringe, fold the strands in half. Insert crochet hook into edge of fabric between first and second stitch of row, coming up from underneath; grasp folded strands at midpoint and pull through to underside of fabric; tuck ends of strands plus any tail left from knitting through the loop; gently tighten loop against edge of fabric.

When all fringe has been attached, trim ends even to 4".
