## MANOS DEL URUGUAY

The coordinating cowl is worked in the round; the resulting "wrong side" also has an attractive pattern.

### sizes

Hat: Brim Circumference: 16 (16<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 17<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 18<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>)'' Fits heads up to 20 (21, 22, 23)'' circumference Shown in 16<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>'' circumference size. *Cowl:* Circumference: 20<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> (30<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>, 41<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>)'' Height: 6<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>'' Shown in 30<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>'' circumference.

#### MATERIALS

Manos del Uruguay SILK BLEND (70% extrafine merino wool, 30% silk; approx. 50g/150 yds), 1 sk each color for hat; 1 (1, 2) sk each color for cowl. Shown in #3079 Chartreuse (MC) and #3031 Nickel (CC) US 4/3.5mm ndls, 16'' and 24'' circular, or 1–2 sizes smaller than gauge needle US 6/4mm ndls, 16'' and 24'' circular and set of doublepointed, or size to obtain gauge stitch markers tapestry needle

## GAUGE

21 stitches and 33 rounds =  $4^{\circ}$  over Stockinette Stitch using larger needles.

Note: It is important to work gauge swatch in the round and block for proper sizing and fit.

## STITCH GUIDE

Stockinette Stitch (over any number of sts) Rnd 1: Knit. Repeat this round for pattern.

K2, p2 Ribbing (multiple of 4 sts) Rnd 1: \*K2, p2; repeat from \* around. Repeat this round for pattern.

Stripe Sequence A (over any number of sts) Rnds I and 2: Knit with CC. Rnds 3–6: Knit with MC. Repeat these 6 rounds for pattern. Stripe Sequence B (over any number of sts) Rnds 1–4: Knit with CC. Rnds 5 and 6: Knit with MC. Repeat these 6 rounds for pattern.

#### ABBREVIATIONS

CC: contrast color CO: cast on decr: decrease dpn(s): double pointed needle(s) incr: increase k: knit MC: main color ndl(s): needle(s) p: purl pm: place marker RLI: use right needle to pick up the st below the next st on the left needle, then knit into it rnd(s): round(s) RS: right side ssk: slip 2 stitches, I at a time, knitwise to the right needle. Return stitches to the left needle in turned position then knit them together through the back loops (1 stitch decreased) st(s): stitch(es)

## NOTES

I recommend working jogless stripes so that the "seam" at the beginning of each color-change round remains virtually invisible. Work jogless stripes as follows: knit one full round of the new color. At the beginning of the second round, pick up the right leg of the stitch below the first stitch of the round (worked in the old color), and place it on the left needle. Knit both the first stitch and the picked-up stitch together. Continue the rest of the round as instructed. Repeat the jogless stripe instructions at the beginning of the second row after every color change.

Also, when you carry your yarns up, try to twist them the same way each time, so that they stay neat.

INSTRUCTIONS HAT BRIM

With smaller needle and MC, CO 84 (88, 92, 96) sts. Join for working in the round, being careful not to twist stitches. Pm to show the beg of round.

Work k2, p2 Ribbing for 4 rounds. Change to CC and work k2, p2 Ribbing for 2 rounds.

#### BODY

Change to larger needles and MC. Incr Rnd: \*K2, RLI; repeat from \* around. [126 (132, 138, 144) stitches] Knit 1 round.

Incr Rnd: \*K7, RLI, k7 (8, 8, 9, 10), RLI, k7; repeat from \* around. [138 (144, 150, 156) stitches] Knit 1 round.

Work rounds I-6 of Stripe Sequence A 4 times. Change to Stripe Sequence B and work 2 (2, 9, 9) rounds, ending after round 2 (2, 3, 3) of pattern.

#### Crown Shaping

Note: Change to double-pointed needles when stitches no longer fit comfortably on circular needle.

Continue working in Stripe Sequence B, and shape crown as follows:

Set-up Rnd: \*K2tog, k19 (20, 21, 22), ssk, pm; repeat from \* 5 more times. [126 (132, 138, 144) stitches remain]

Knit I round in appropriate color to remain in pattern. Decr Rnd: \*K2tog, knit to 2 stitches before next marker, ssk, sl marker; repeat from \* 5 more times. [12 stitches decreased] Repeat last 2 rounds 7 (7, 8, 8) more times. [30 (36, 30, 36) stitches remain]

Sizes 16 (-, 17½, -)" only: Next Rnd: \*K2tog, k1, remove marker; repeat from \* 5 more times. [24 stitches remain]

Sizes - (16¾, -, 18¼)'' only: Next Rnd: \*K2tog, ssk, remove marker; repeat from \* 5 more times. [24 stitches remain]

#### All Sizes:

Cut yarn, leaving at least a 5" tail. Thread tail onto tapestry ndl and draw tail through remaining stitches.

#### FINISHING

Weave in ends. Block hat around a dinner plate or other disc approximately  $9\frac{1}{2}$  (10, 10<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>, 10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>)" in diameter.



## COWL

With smaller needle and MC, CO 108 (160, 216) sts. Join for working in the round, being careful not to twist stitches. Pm to show the beg of round.

Work k2, p2 Ribbing for 4 rounds. Change to CC and work k2, p2 Ribbing for 2 rounds.

Change to larger needles and work rounds 3–6 of Stripe Sequence A once, then work rounds 1–6 3 times, ending after 4 rounds of MC.

Work rounds 1–6 of Stripe Sequence B 3 times, then work rounds 1–4 once more, ending after 4 rounds of CC.

Change to smaller needles and MC and work k2, p2 Ribbing for 2 rounds. Change to CC and work k2, p2 Ribbing for 4 rounds.

BO in pattern. Cut yarn, leaving at least a 5" tail.

FINISHING Weave in ends and block to measurements.
