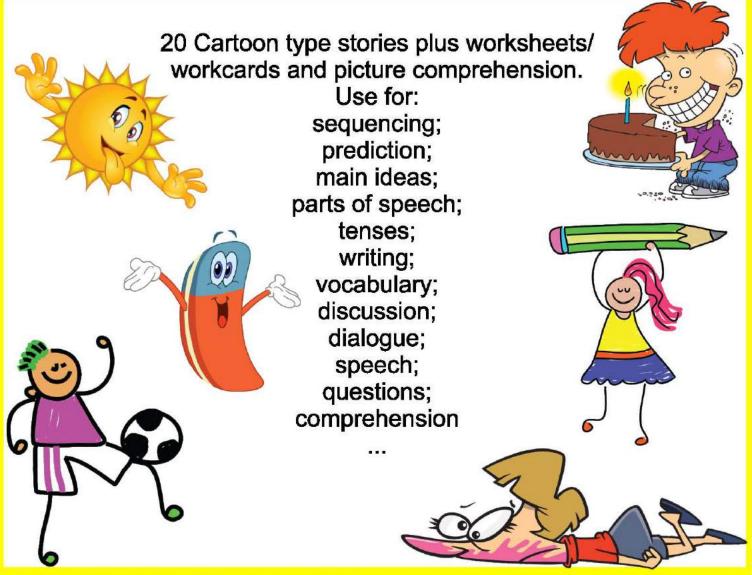

How to use this book:-

- -This book does not need to be used in any specific order.
- -The page numbers are just a guide to help you find what you are looking for.
- -This book contains 20 cartoon picture stories in black and white and in colour as well as worksheets which can be used in conjunction with the picture stories.
- -These picture stories come in different sizes and can be used in various ways and to teach different skills.

Pages I - 20: A4 black and white cartoon picture stories.

Make copies for the children. They cut the stories up and re-arrange them in the correct order. They can paste it in their books or on the worksheet provided on page 51 (make a copy of the worksheet for each child).

<u>Pages 21 – 40: A4 cartoon picture stories in colour.</u>

The same as the black and white ones, but these can be used as sequencing cards. Print them out (as many copies as you would like of each one for the children to work individually, in pairs or groups). Paste onto a thick board and/or laminate.

Cut up into individual frames and store each story in a small plastic bag. Hand them out to the children to arrange in order or use in one of the other ways discussed under "Activities".

They can also be used to project onto a screen or Smart board. (IF A CHILD ARRANGES IT IN A DIFFERENT ORDER, IT IS FINE AS LONG AS THEY CAN JUSTIFY WHY THEY HAVE DONE IT AND THEIR STORY MAKES SENSE.)

A5 cartoon picture stories in black and white (pages 41 - 50)

Two stories on one A5 page. These can be used as answer cards (they are in the correct sequencing order) or for any of the applicable activities listed on the next page.

ACTIVITIES:

SEQUENCING:

Use pages I - 40 for sequencing and recognizing the correct order of doing something.

VOCABULARY:

Use the picture stories to extend the children's vocabulary. Vocabulary words can be written on flashcards or on the board. This can be done in any language.

DISCUSSION:

The picture stories can be projected on to a screen or smart board. or the A5 stories can be used. Use the stories for discussion, e.g. how to bake tarts; different types of tarts; safety when baking, etc. Use in any language and to teach any language.

GRAMMAR:

Use to discuss parts of speech, prepositions, opposites, plurals ... Use the Parts of Speech worksheet on page 54.

TENSES:

Use the stories to teach the children tenses, e.g. re-telling (or writing) the story or sentences about the stories, in the present, past and even the future tenses.

DRAMA:

Let the children act out the picture stories, even adding their own details and endings. This can be done with or without dialogue.

DEDUCTION:

Picture frames can be blanked out at random. The children then draw or write what they think is happening in that frame.

PREDICTION:

Blank out the last frame in a picture story on pages 41 – 50 before making copies. Let the children write or draw what they think would happen. Preferably use stories they have not yet discussed.

The worksheet on page 53 "What happens next" can be used for this activity. There are two copies on each worksheet so you need to print less.

Instead of using the black and white copies you could remove the last frame out of your coloured copy packets. They then arrange the cards in sequence and complete the ending in writing.

MAIN IDEAS:

Use the picture stories and the worksheet on page 52 to teach main ideas.

WRITING:

Use the worksheets on pages 55 - 57 to encourage descriptive, paragraph and letter writing as well as summarizing the stories. with the worksheets on pages 55 - 57.

LIFE SKILLS:

These picture stories can also be used for life skills and theme work, e.g. discuss seasons for planting and growing seeds; travelling; traffic safety when riding a bicycle, etc.

CLASS ACTIVITIES:

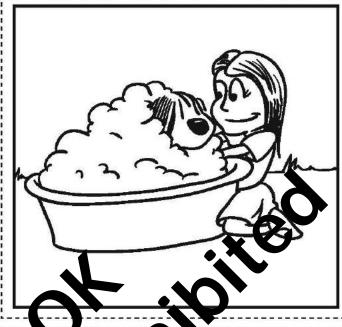
Appropriate class activities can be arranged in conjunction with the picture stories, e.g. baking, making tea, changing a tyre, visit to the airport, farm, etc.

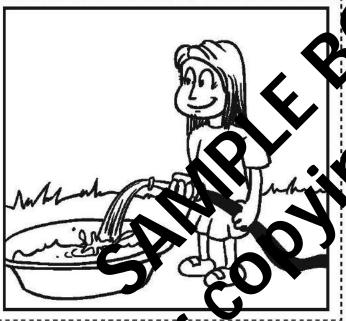
