## TEACHER'S GUIDELINES

This book can be used in different ways:
1.) Each page can be cut in half (A5 size) and mounted on cardboard. The worksheets can then be used as work cards. The children can work from the tessellation work cards onto blocked paper and the symmetry workcards can be traced or redrawn.
2.) The pages can be photocopied and be used as worksheets.
3.) The books can be photocopied and made up into workbooks for each child. The children can then work in their own time and at their own pace. It can also be used for extension work.

## TESSELLLATION INSTRUCTIONS:

To tesselate (or tile) means to fill a plane surface with a specific shape in such a way that no gaps are left and none of the shapes overlap. The shapes may be rotated by NOT turned the wrong way around.
Each page has been divided into 2 sections. A polygon has been drawn in the top right-hand corner of each section.
Draw a tessellation of each polygon in the relevant blocked section, to form an interesting pattern.
Divide each blocked section in half and try to draw a tessellation of each polygon in at least 2 different ways. Use 2 or more colours to shade in the polygons in order to form different and interesting patterns.
Where 2 shapes are drawn in the blocked section, you must use both shapes to tessellate the surface.
Where no shapes are drawn, draw your own and experiment with whether they will tessellate or not. If you are not sure whether a polygon will tessellate in a certain way, cut out a few samples of each polygon to practice tessellating with, before you draw them in. Blocked paper can also be used to practice on.
