LALAY WANDJINA'

New works from Angelina Karadada Boona

Lalay Wandjina is Angelina Karadada Boona's third solo exhibition with us and showcases the artist's creative progression of the past few years.

Angelina's commitment to the painstaking traditional techniques of collecting and mixing onmal (natural white and pink ochres) with goorin (white gum sap) is steadfast as ever. But this new body of work explores new mediums, depicting the ethereal Wandjina emerging from the clouds on ceramics, board and bark, as well as canvas and paper.

The Wandjina story is both mystical and profound. When rain and flood threatened their Country, the ancestors took shelter in a cave. As the monsoon arrived, the Wandjina emerged from the clouds to keep them safe and ensure an abundance of bush foods after the

rains. Similar mark-making can be found in ancient rock art throughout the Kimberley region and the rainmaker spirit watches over the Worrorra, Ngainyin and Wunambal peoples to this day.

In Angelina's work, the strength and character of the Wandjina emerges with grace and subtly, echoing the rhythm of the artist's Country. It has been recognised at shows including the prestigious Telstra NATSIA Awards, features in national and state gallery collections and is in high demand with collectors both in Australia and overseas.

Angelina is also an important leader in Kalumburu, the most northerly community in WA. She works tirelessly to preserve and promote her culture, recently collaborating with a linguist to produce the first the first-ever Wunumbal language dictionary.

Aboriginal Contemporary is thrilled that Angelina has agreed to come to Sydney for the opening of *Lalay Wandjina* and talk about the ancient Wandjina story, her Country and her art. Her presentation at 3.00pm on 27 April and is not to be missed.









Framing: Please note this artwork is framed – it is float mounted, where all the edges of the artwork are exposed and separated from the glass with a plastic spacer. The art appears as if it is 'floating' in the frame because you can't see it mounted to anything. There is an 8cm wide mount board around the artwork and the frame is matt white. The glass used is art glass which reduces reflexion and has a UV protective layer. Further images of this are available on request.
