The Cape May National Wildlife Refuge was established as part of the National Wildlife Refuge System in 1989. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has acquired about 11,500 acres already, and with the support of the Friends group, the refuge will continue to work towards acquiring the congressionally approved acquisition lands, which would ultimately double its size to 21,820 acres of precious wildlife habitat in the Cape May Peninsula. With only five full-time staff, it needs the help of Friends!

CAPE MAY NWR IS COMPRISED OF 3 DIVISIONS:



The Great Cedar Swamp Division is in the northern end of the refuge in Dennis and Upper Townships and includes salt marsh, hardwood swamp, bog, grassland and large tracts of forested upland.



The Delaware Bay Division is located in Middle Township and extends along five miles of the Delaware Bay. Bayshore, salt marsh, wet and dry forests, vernal pools and grasslands are found in this division.



The Two Mile Beach Unit is a barrier island with beachfront, tidal ponds and maritime forest in Lower Township.
