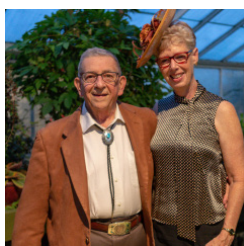

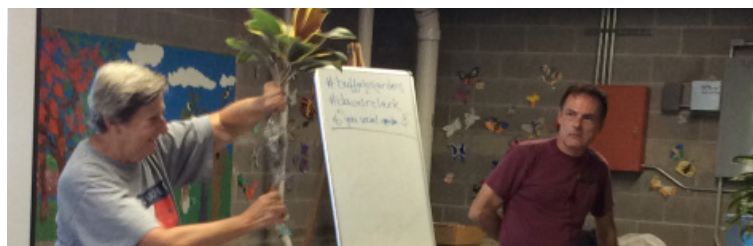

Perfume in Your Garden

We generally pay attention to what a plant looks like, while completely ignoring another wonderful characteristic: aroma. If you don't have any fragrant plants, you're missing out.

When we think of fragrant flowers, roses immediately come to mind. While some roses are

quite fragrant, others have no aroma at all. Investigate carefully when choosing roses.

Many perennials have flowers with strong scents, including phlox, oriental lilies and lavender. Don't forget about flowering shrubs, such as lilacs. And the blossoms on fruit trees, such as apple, smell lovely.

Herbs, such as mint, sage and thyme are also fragrant. Place mint along a path where its scent will be dispersed as you brush against the plant. Low-growing thyme can be placed between pavers so it releases its aroma as you step.

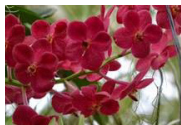

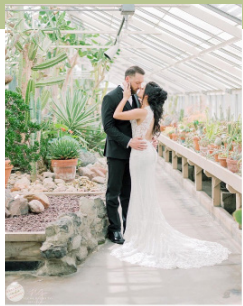

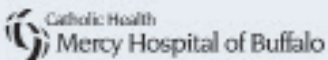
