



Learn at Home: Spring Rabbit

Supplies Needed:

- Paper
- Scissors
- Glue or tape
- Markers, Crayons, or Colored Pencils

Instructions:

1. Print out the template on the following page and cut out all shapes. If you don't have a printer, draw a rabbit shape and some grass. Then cut out all shapes.
2. Color your grass and your rabbit. You can make your rabbit any color you want. Don't forget to give your rabbit a face!
3. Glue or tape your grass to the top of your rabbit so it looks like the rabbit is hiding in the grass!



Learn a little something:

Did you know that there are over 50 different species of rabbits and hares? Rabbits can be found in many parts of the world in different environments. They can live in forests, meadows, grasslands, wetlands, and even deserts! They also vary greatly in size. The Flemish giant rabbit can grow to be 2.5 feet long and weigh as much as 22 pounds! That's one big rabbit! They are often associated with spring. Spring is when rabbits have their babies. Did you know that a baby rabbit is called a kit or kitten?
