Mascot 2012 Cabernet Sauvignon Napa Valley Retail - \$130

The Mascot is a Napa Valley cabernet sauvignon blended from distinct hillside vineyards, specifically the younger vines of BOND, Harlan Estate, and Promontory. It started out as a small project championed by Will Harlan and shared among the family, winemaking team, and close friends. Drawing fruit from blocks of recently replanted vineyards, this exciting new wine shares a unique glimpse into the evolution and pedigree of its parent wines.

As a longtime fan of the Harlan Family, I'm thrilled to carry on the spirit of this small production with you, my friends!

The 2012 Napa Valley growing season's warm and gentle conditions are reflected in the balanced, lush nature of the wine. Red fruit and subtle spice with structured tannins lead into a lengthy, elegant finish. It's expressive and approachable early in life and will also evolve well into the future. Feel free to open a bottle and drink it now, or age for many years to come.

Tamber Bey 2014 Rabicano Retail - \$65

Tamber Bey's estate-grown Bordeaux-blend wine, Rabicano (pronounced Rab-i-kawno), is a masterful blend that exhibits the unique traits of the Deux Chevaux Vineyard, a strong core of Cabernet Sauvignon and Merlot with the bolstering power of Petit Verdot and the aromatics of Cabernet Franc

Tamber Bey reflects the names of owner Barry Waitte's first two Arabian endurance horses, Tamborina (Tamber) and Bayamo (Bey).

Winery Notes: The nose is complex and reflects the blending of the four varietals; very elegant and fragrant. Aromas of currant, raspberry and cherry, with sweet oak, a very delicate smokiness, a touch of bay leaf and barley water. The mouth-feel delivers medium body and elegance. Red fruit flavors, some nice spices including white pepper, and delicate truffle notes evolve into a long finish that delivers cherry pit and cola.

Composition: 60% Cabernet Sauvignon, 26% Merlot, 7% Cabernet Franc,
5% Petit Verdot & 2% Malbec

Cooperage: 100% French Oak
