




SNOWDRIFT

This page can be copied onto the paper side of a piece of 8 1/2" x 11" freezer paper to use as cutting templates. These freezer paper templates can be reused multiple times.

SNOWDRIFT

ASSEMBLY:

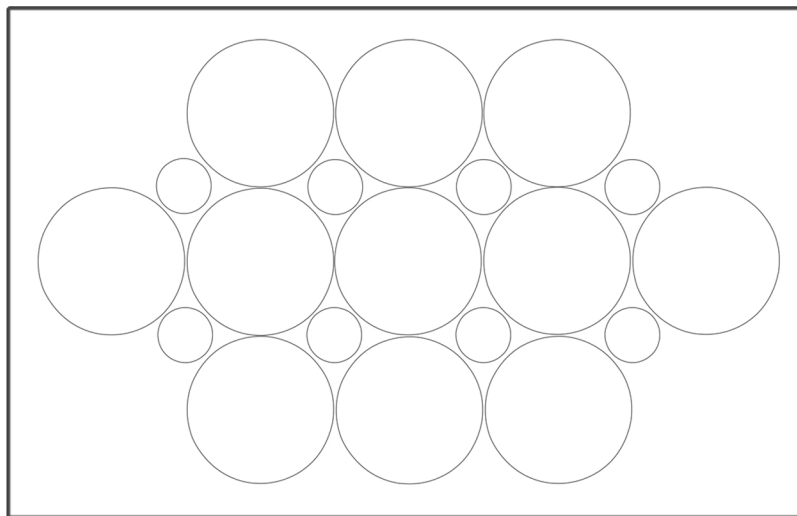
· Layout the 11 large circles, 8 of the small circles, centered top and bottom, side to side, as shown in the diagram below.

· Baste the circles in place.

· Using the 12wt Sulky thread whip stitch the circles to the background.

Because there isn't a backing to the table runner, carefully hide your knots between the circles and the background wool.

**If you choose to use a blanket stitch, you will need more thread than the petite spool in the supply list.*

SNOWDRIFT

SUPPLIES:

- Felted Wool - 26" x 26" (see diagram below for more precise wool needs)
**the sample was stitched using ivory colored wool but this would also be pretty using a wintry blue and ecru thread. Directions for felting are available at KathySchmitzStudio.blogspot.com or searching on YouTube*
- Valdani 12wt pearl cotton Wheat Husk O 514 - 1 ball
- Sulky 12wt thread deep ecru - petite spool 50yd
**This thread is used to whip stitch the circles in place. Any heavy thread that matches the wool color will work well.*
- 1/2" buttons with 4 holes - 11 ivory colored
- ivory seed beads - around 100
- chenille yarn for trim - 2 yd
- freezer paper to cut circle templates

CUTTING LAYOUT:

Cut table runner background first - 14" x 22"

Print the circle template page onto the paper side of freezer paper. Iron it to the the wool. Cut out the 3 large circles, 2 medium circles and 6 small circles. Remove the freezer paper from the wool and reuse it to cut out the remaining circles.

You will need a total of 11 large circles (4"), 11 medium circles (2 1/2"), and 19 small circles (1 1/2").
