

## Native Seeds/SEARCH Community Seed Grant Application Form

Seed grants are available to organizations in the Greater Southwest Region\*. These grants are designed to support the work of educators and social organizations working to enhance the nutritional, social, economic, or environmental health of underprivileged groups in the region, while simultaneously keeping locally-adapted crop varieties alive and in active use in farms and gardens. Priority is given to projects that will clearly benefit underrepresented groups. *Seed Grants are not available to individuals*. Examples of successful seed grants include school gardens, demonstration gardens for seed libraries, community therapy or rehabilitation gardens, senior center gardens, and other community oriented gardens. Please see our webpage for more information. **Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, and are typically filled within 6 weeks.** 

\*This region generally includes Arizona, Utah, Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma, parts of Texas, and southern California. Applications from Northwest Mexico are also welcome, but further details around international transportation will have to be worked out. Our seeds are best adapted to this arid region, many are day-length sensitive, and many are meaningful to the people who have inhabited, or whose descendants continue to inhabit, this region. If you are from a Native community in an arid place outside these states, please contact us.

Native American individuals in the Greater Southwest are eligible for free seeds under our Free Seed Program (see our website for further information), but Native American organizations should apply through the Community Seed Grants program using this application form.
