Dear Mr. Hadsall,

The anti-exposure suit drawing S-3920-() has had a minor change to it. Revision E and this letter are being submitted to bring our records up to date.

Revision E dated 9/22, removed four assemblies from the Bill of Materials (BOM). These assemblies (-Y2, -Y3, -Y5 and -Y6) included a zip-in liner that will no longer be produced. The associated items for these liners were also removed from the BOM.

Two sub-assemblies were added to the BOM. These sub-assemblies (-1Y1 and -1Y4) are the basic pilot and passenger suits, without hood and glove kits or liners. All associated items for these sub-assemblies (items 1 through 9, and items 14 through 17) were removed from the remaining assemblies, -Y1, -Y4, -Y7 and -Y8. These assemblies now include one of the two suit sub-assemblies (items 20 and 21).

Switlik has reviewed this change, and all applicable data, and consider this a minor change per 14 CFR Part 21, Subpart O, §21.619 and as defined in our quality control manual.

We hereby certify that this anti-exposure suit meets or exceeds all the requirements of 14 CFR 21.8(d) and ETSO-2C503, complies with 14 CFR Part 21, Subpart O, and will be manufactured under the strict quality control procedures on file with your Saddle Brook, New Jersey office.
