Anthony Boucher's A Rocket To The Morgue

Legendary science fiction author Fowler Faulkes may be dead, but his creation, the iconic Dr. Derringer, lives on in popular culture. Or at least, the character would live on, if not for Faulkes's protective and greedy heir Hilary, who, during his time as the inflexible guardian of the estate, has created countless enemies in the relatively small community of writers of the genre. Fully aware of his unpopularity, Hilary fears for his life after two near misses with potentially fatal "accidents" and calls the police for help. But when an explosive box of chocolates is delivered to his doorstep, it becomes clear that death awaits around every corner as the stalker, who has already killed, will find a way to murder him, no matter how impossible it may seem with so much police protection. Detective Terry Marshall and his assistant, the inquisitive nun, Sister Ursula, will have to work overtime to keep the killer from catching him-a task that requires a deep dive into the strange, idiosyncratic world of science fiction in its early days.

With characters based heavily on Anthony Boucher's friends at the Manana Literary Society, including Robert Heinlein, L. Ron Hubbard, and Jack Parsons, Rocket to the Morgue is both a classic locked room mystery and an enduring portrait of a real-life writing community. Reprinted for the first time in over thirty years, the book is a must-read for fans of mysteries and science fiction alike.

We take excellent care of all books, but please understand that we are not responsible for books lost or damaged in transit or on premises. It is essential that you call before delivering books here. Some of the authors are unwilling to sign out of print books, some are on schedules too tight to permit it, etc.

International rates vary.

For foreign multi-book parcels, we charge the actual Postal Service charge plus a handling fee of \$3.00 per parcel and \$1.00 for every additional book, which covers packing materials and staff time spent wrapping books, etc.

Otto's Favorite

Hunter, Stephen, Game of Snipers, Putnam.



One of the great characters of thriller fiction is Bob Lee Swagger, the extraordinarily skilled sharpshooter who was given the nickname "Bob the Nailer" for his uncommon accuracy. He is now 72 and just wants to be left alone, sitting on his porch and devoting a couple of hours a day to "just watch the weather and the grass change." His peace is disturbed when a woman drives up and tells of her quest to find and kill the man, a brilliant mercenary known as Juba the Sniper, who killed her son in the Mideast. Naturally, Bob does what he can to talk her out of her quest for revenge, but she is more determined than anyone he has ever encountered. She traveled to Baghdad, was beaten and raped, went to Moscow, Bulgaria, and South Africa, learned Arabic, became a Muslim, studied the Koran, studied ballistics and learned to shoot. She cannot be turned back from her mission and wants Swagger's help. "You've got some sand in you," he says. "I respect sand." Respect for this strange woman, plus the chance to get Juba in his sights, is enough to get him started on what will turn out to be an epic battle with radical Muslim terrorists, Mexican drug cartels, and the complexities of international

Bowden, Mark, The Last Stone, Atlantic Monthly Press.

On March 29, 1979, sisters Katherine and Sheila Lyon, ages 10 and twelve, visited a shopping mall in suburban Washington, D. C. and vanished without a trace. As a young reporter, Mark Bowden covered the story for a Baltimore newspaper. Forty years later he has written a deeply disturbing account of the crime and it's aftermath. We are introduced to a group of dedicated detectives, but also to some of the most deplorable people imaginable. A break in the case came in 2013 when a detective came across a 1975 witness statement by Lloyd Welch, now serving time for child molestation. Hoping Welch could connect their prime suspect, now dead, to the crime, detectives went to interview Welch, who was more than eager to talk, but he's a compulsive liar. He points the finger to various members of his deplorable family. As the detectives make

their way around the lies they come to realize they're speaking to the man they've been searching for. A lot of the book consists of the interviews with Welch, so you have the feeling of being in the room as they question him and watch as he digs his own well-earned grave. HC. \$27.00.

A little girl is abducted. Her mother, Rachel O'Neill, gets a call. If she wants to see her daughter alive again she must do two things: pay \$25,000, and kidnap another child. Rachel is now part of The Chain. Her daughter won't be released until she's committed a kidnapping herself and passed The Chain's instructions on to the next parent. Rachel isn't the first and she won't be the last.

Once Rachel's shock subsides, she quickly realizes that The Chain is no practical joke. They are watching her every move and any false step will mean her daughter's certain death. With no choice but to frantically do everything in her power to save her daughter, Rachel finds herself turning cash into Bitcoin, buying a gun, and searching for vulnerable children on the internet...

The Chain is the definition of a page-turner. From page one the action never stops and McKinty is a master at making such an extraordinary premise feel heartbreakingly real as the love of a parent is twisted into unspeakable evil.

The devilishly clever plan has claimed victims from right under the cops' noses, including from the ranks of the police, and it all starts with a 'death notice' announcing the next victim, the crimes committed, and the date of the execution.
