How to Care for Microfiber Towels

icrofiber towels aren't your mom's old towels. They're the result of cutting-edge technology that has taken cleaning and wiping to the next level. The fibers on microfiber towels have a greater surface area that makes them ideal for wiping and cleaning windows and other surfaces where you don't want any streaks. The better you take care of them, the longer they will last and the better they'll perform.

Microfiber towels can be used right out of the packaging, requiring no advanced prep. Caring for them long-term, however, requires some consideration.

Microfiber towels should not be laundered like ordinary towels. In fact, caring for microfiber towels can be tricky if you don't know what you're doing.

Listed below are some do's and don'ts to help you extend the life of your towel and keep it performing for hundreds of washings.

The Do's of Maintaining Microfiber Towels

To minimize lint on a new microfiber towel, run them through the spin-cycle several times to rid the towels of excess lint from manufacturing.

Wash microfiber towels on the cold setting.

Air dry microfiber towels when possible. If using a dryer, use the lowest setting for the shortest period of time. As you gain experience, you'll better know the fastest dry time for the best results.

Add a cup of vinegar every few washes to get rid of any musty smells and wax build-up. Usually, a towel that streaks is indicative of pores clogged with chemicals, soaps or waxes.

Add a half cup of baking soda to the wash to help restore the fluffiness of the microfibers. Higher piles of the microfiber loops allow for better cleaning and drying capacity.

The Don'ts of Maintaining Microfiber Towels

NEVER USE BLEACH OR FABRIC SOFTENEr when washing microfibers.

DO NOT WASH OLD TOWELS WITH NEW ONES.

DO NOT WASH DIFFERENT TYPES of towels together.

DO NOT WASH YOUR MICROFIBER TOWELS WITH ANY OTHER TYPES OF LAUNDRY.

NEVER OVERLOAD the washing machine or dryer.
