# Pin Lover's Club: Star Spangled Mini-Pinnie



## Star Spangled Materials:

#### Pin Lover's Club Pins

Fabric: (cut these pieces\*)

Navy print—

(5) 3 x 3" (for units A-C)

Red print—

(2) 4¼ x 1½" (for unit D)

(2)  $7 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$ " (for unit E)

6½ x 5¾" (for backing)

White tone on tone—

(4) 3 x 3 (for units A-C)

(2)  $7 \times 1\frac{1}{2}$  (for unit E)

(1) 4¼ x 1½ (for unit D)

Wool Roving (for stuffing)

## Star Spangled Instructions:

- 1. Use the foundation paper pattern sheet to assemble your flag block. See additional instructions on the back.
- 2. The flag block should measure 6½ x 5¾". Remove the paper from the backside of your block. Pin the backing rectangle on top of the block (right-sides-together) with the edges lined up.
- 3. Sew all the way around (don't leave an opening) with a ¼" seam.
- 4. Use our <u>Franken-Stitch Finish</u> technique to turn your pincushion right-side-out. Make a 2" diagonal slit in the middle of the backing fabric ONLY.

- 5. Turn the pillow right-side-out through the slit.
- 6. Stuff the pillow.
- 7. Whipstitch the slit closed.
- 8. Optional: Add an applique heart to cover your stitches.
- 9. Add your Pin Lover's Club pins to your new pincushion and enjoy!!!

<sup>\*</sup>Fabric measurements are generous to ensure success for beginners.

### How to Foundation Paper Piece:

- 1. Roughly cut apart your 5 paper pattern units (A,B,C,D and E). **Don't** trim off the ¼" seam allowance and don't cut apart the sections of each unit.
- 2. Begin with unit A. Refer to the color coded sections to help with fabric placement. Turn the paper upside-down (so you can't see the lines) and center a piece of fabric (right-side-up) over Al. Hold in position with a pin.

Tip: Using a lightbox or window under your pattern helps you make sure your fabric is in the correct position.


- 3. Flip to the paper side to find the line between A1 and A2. Flip back to the fabric side and position a piece of white fabric (for A2) right-sides-together on top of A1 and overlapping the line between A1 and A2 by at least ¼".
- 4. Hold the fabric and paper layers together and flip to the paper side. Sew along the line between A1 and A2.

Tip: Use a 1.5 stitch length when sewing through your paper pattern. This helps perforate the paper and makes it easy-to-remove later.

- 5. Fold the paper away from the fabric, on the line where you just sewed. Trim the exposed seam allowance to ¼", cutting only the fabric.
- 6. Open the paper flat and press open the white fabric to cover section A2.
- 7. Now find the line between A2 and A3. Position a piece of white fabric (for A3) right-sides-together on top of A1-2 and overlapping the line between A2 and A3 by at least ¼".
- 8. Hold the fabric and paper layers together and flip to the paper side. Sew along the line between A2 and A3.
- 9. Fold the paper away from the fabric, on the line where you just sewed. Trim the exposed seam allowance to ¼"cutting only the fabric.
- 10. Open the paper flat and press open the fabric to cover section A3.
- 11. Trim off any excess fabric and paper that is left on the outside of the seam allowance.
- 12. Now that you've finished unit A, assemble units B, C, D, and E in the same manner.
- 13. Then follow the diagram at the bottom of the foundation paper pattern sheet to assemble the units into a flag.




This grey square should measure 1 inch.

A-C to D

A-D to E

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
