Bob McKillop is the curator of the Willoughby Museum and author of the 2012 book *Managing our Waste: An environmental history of Flat Rock Creek and the Willoughby Incinerator 1900-2011*. His talk is about how local governments on Sydney's lower north shore developed responses to sanitation and garbage control following the 1900 bubonic plague. Particular attention is given to the Willoughby Incinerator that was designed by Walter Burley Griffin and served as a waste disposal and night soil repository for several lower north shore councils, including Mosman. Bob also discusses the Willoughby Tip, well known to many Mosman residents.
