

Furl's Crochet
Huggable Ice Cream

MATERIALS

WW yarn in **tan**, **white**, and **pink**

Size K (6.5mm) Odyssey hook

Scrap yarn in black

10mm plastic snap-in eyes (optional, not recommended for small children)

Stuffing

Scissors

Tapestry needle

Big scoop

With two strands of **pink** held together, ch 2 or make a magic loop.

1. 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook / magic loop (7)
2. 2 sc in each sc around (14)
3. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next sc* rep *-* around (21)
4. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 2 sc* rep *-* around (28)
5. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 3 sc* rep *-* around (35)
6. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 4 sc* rep *-* around (42)
7. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 5 sc* rep *-* around (49)
8. sc in 1st 4 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc*, rep *-* 6x, sc in last 2 sc (55)
9. sc in 1st 4 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc* rep *-* 6x, sc in last 3 sc (61)
10. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 8 sc* rep *-* 6x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 7 sc (69)
- 11-19. sc in each sc around (69)
20. *sc dec, sc in next 8 sc* rep *-* 6x, sc dec, sc in last 7 sc (62)
21. sc in each sc around (62)
22. *sc dec, sc in next 7 sc* rep *-* 6x, sc dec, sc in last 6 sc (55)
23. working in FLO, *skip 1st sc, 4 dc in next sc, skip next sc, slp st in next sc* rep *-* around **FO, leaving a very long tail to sew the scoop to the cone later.**

Put the plastic eyes in between rounds 19-18 of the scoop, spaced about 5 stitches apart.

Using black scrap yarn, embroider a small smile centered between the eyes, as pictured.

If making this project for a nursery, I recommend embroidering all facial details to prevent small parts from becoming a choking hazard. **Repeat for smaller scoop.**

Lil scoop

With two strands of **white** held together, ch 2 or make a magic loop.

1. 7 sc in 2nd ch from hook / magic loop (7)
2. 2 sc in each sc around (14)
3. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next sc* rep *-* around (21)
4. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 2 sc* rep *-* around (28)
5. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 3 sc* rep *-* around (35)
6. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 4 sc* rep *-* around (42)
7. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 5 sc* rep *-* around (49)
8. sc in 1st 4 sc, *2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc*, rep *-* 6x, sc in last 2 sc (55)
- 9-16. sc in each sc around (55)
17. *sc dec, sc in next 6 sc* rep *-* around (49)
18. sc in each sc around (49)
19. *sc dec, sc in next 5 sc* rep *-* around (42)
20. working in FLO, *skip 1st sc, 4 dc in next sc, skip next sc, slp st in next sc* rep *-* around **FO, leaving a long tail to sew the baby scoop to the top of the big scoop.**

Put the plastic eyes in between rounds 14-15 of the scoop, spaced about 4 stitches apart. I put mine in crooked to give the little scoop a playful, lopsided appearance.

Cone

With two strands of **tan** held together, ch 2 or make a magic loop.

1. 8 sc in 2nd ch from hook / magic loop (8)
2. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next sc* rep *-* around (12)
3. sc in each sc around (12)
4. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next sc* rep *-* around (18)
5. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 4 sc* rep *-* 3x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 2 sc (22)
6. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 4 sc* rep *-* 4x, sc in last 2 sc (26)
7. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 6 sc* rep *-* 3x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 4 sc (30)
8. sc in each sc around (30)
9. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 6 sc* rep *-* 4x, sc in last 2 sc (34)
10. sc in each sc around (34)
11. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 6 sc* rep *-* 4x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 5 sc (39)
12. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 7 sc* rep *-* 4x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 6 sc (44)
13. sc in each sc around (44)
14. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 8 sc* rep *-* 4x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 7 sc (49)
15. sc in each sc around (49)
16. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 9 sc* rep *-* 4x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 8 sc (54)
17. sc in each sc around (54)
18. *2 sc in 1st sc, sc in next 10 sc* rep *-* 4x, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 9 sc (59)
19. sc in each sc around (59)

FO and weave in the ends

STUFF the cone firmly. *Grab the big scoop and make sure it is stuffed firmly.*

Using the ends from the **big scoop**, thread your yarn needle (both strands of yarn) and whipstitch the last round of the cone to the **BLO** of the last round of the **big scoop** (beneath the scallops). *The big scoop is only 4 stitches less than the cone, so the two match up almost stitch-for-stitch.*

Add more stuffing as necessary while you're sewing. Weave in the ends.

Make sure the lil scoop is stuffed, then thread both FO ends onto your yarn needle. Sew the lil scoop to the top of the big scoop, either perfectly centered on the top of the bigger scoop or slightly off-kilter as pictured below.
