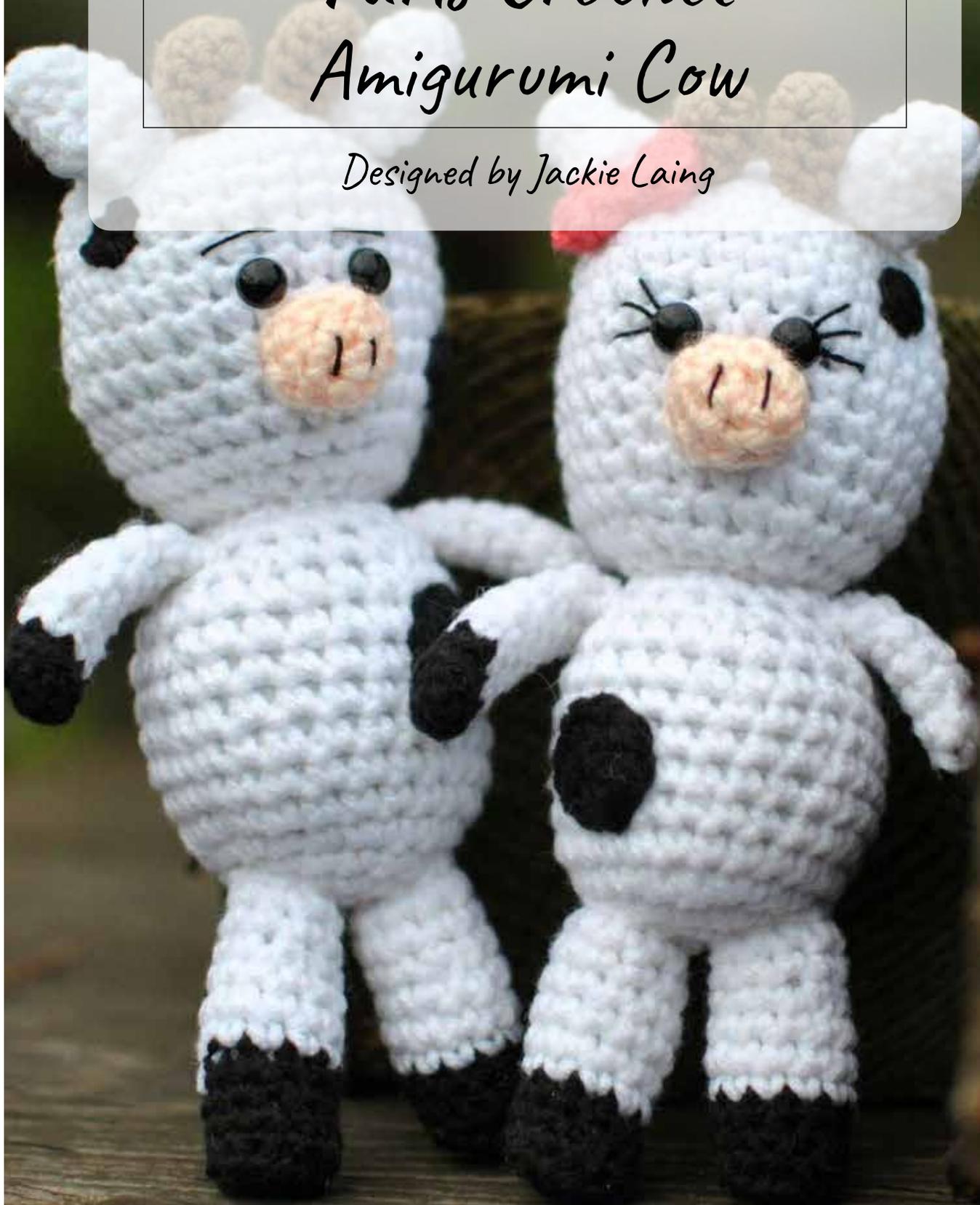


Furl's Crochet Amigurumi Cow

MATERIALS

Bunny Materials

[3.50 mm Furls Hook](#)

Patons Astra Yarn in your choice of colors

100-150 yards total per cow

Fiberfill for Stuffing, Scissors, Yarn Needle

2 Amigurumi Safety Eyes

ABBREVIATIONS

ch-chain, sc-single crochet, inc-increase,
dec-decrease, fo-fasten off

Cow Pattern

Head

Rnd 1: Starting at the top of the head with white yarn (or the color of your choosing) sc x 6 in a magic ring, or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook (6)

Rnd 2: Inc x 6 (12)

Rnd 3: [Sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd 4: Sc x 18 (18)

Rnd 5: [Sc x 2, inc] x 6 (24)

Rnd 6: [Sc x 3, inc] x 6 (30)

Rnd 7-10: Sc x 30 (30)

Rnd 11: Sc x 11, place your first eye in the last stitch that you just did, sc x 3, place your second eye in the last stitch that you just did, sc x 16 (30)

Rnd 12: Sc x 30 (30)

Rnd 13: [Sc x 4, dec] x 5 (25)

Rnd 14-16: Sc x 25 (25)

Rnd 17: [Sc x 3, dec] x 5 (20)

Rnd 18: Stuff your cow's head firmly from this point on as you are decreasing, dec x 10 (10)

Rnd 19: Dec x 5 (5)

Rnd 20: Sc, dec x 2, **fo** (3)

Arm (make 2)

Rnd 1: Starting at the bottom of the arm with black yarn (or the color of your choosing) sc x 6 in a magic ring, or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook (6)

Rnd 2: Inc, sc x 5 (7)

Rnd 3-4: Sc x 7 (7)

Rnd 5: Switch to white and sc x 7 (7)

Rnd 6-7: Sc x 7 (7)

Rnd 8: Dec, sc x 5 (6)

Rnd 9-11: Sc x 6, **fo** at the end of Rnd11 (6)

Horn (make 2)

Rnd 1: Starting at the top of the horn with tan yarn sc x 6 in a magic ring, or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook (6)

Rnd 2-5: Sc x 5, **fo** at the end of Rnd5 (5)

Ear (make 2)

Rnd 1: Starting at the tip of the ear with white yarn sc x 6 in a magic ring, or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook (6)

Rnd 2-3: Sc x 6 (6)

Rnd 4: [Inc, sc x 2] x 2 (8)

Rnd 5: Sc x 8, **fo** (8)

Snout

Row 1: With pink colored yarn ch x 4 (4)

Row 2: Turn, sc x 3 (3)

Rnd 3: Do not turn, sc x 3 down the opposite side of work (3)

Rnd 4: Inc, sc x 2, inc, sc x 2 (8)

Rnd 5-6: Sc x 8, **fo** at the end of Rnd6 (8)

Body

Rnd 1: Starting at the bottom of your body sc x 6 in a magic ring, or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook (6)

Rnd2: Inc x 6 (12)

Rnd3: [Sc, inc] x 6 (18)

Rnd4: Sc x 18 (18)

Rnd5: [Sc x 2, inc] x 6 (24)

Rnd6-12: Sc x 24 (24)

Rnd13: [Sc x 2, dec] x 6 (18)

Rnd14: Sc x 18 (18)

Rnd15: Dec x 9, **fo** (9)

Leg (make 2)

Rnd1: Starting at the bottom of your leg with black yarn sc x 6 in a magic ring or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook (6)

Rnd2: Inc x 6 (12)

Rnd3: Sc x 12 (12)

Rnd4: Sc x 5, dec, sc x 5 (11)

Rnd5: Sc x 11 (11)

Rnd6: Change to white yarn and sc x 11 (11)

Rnd7-8: Sc x 11 (11)

Rnd9: Dec, sc x 4, dec, sc x 3 (9)

Rnd10-11: Sc x 9, **fo** at the end of Rnd11 (9)

Large spot

Rnd1: With black yarn sc x 6 in a magic ring, or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook (6)

Rnd2: Inc x 6, **fo** (12)

Small spot

Rnd1: With black yarn sc x 6 in a magic ring or ch x 2 and do 6sc in the second ch from your hook, **fo** (6)

Assembly

Stuff your cows head and body firmly. Sew the body onto the head. Sew on the ears, horns and snout. Sew on the arms and legs. Embroider on the eyebrows and spot. Weave in all ends and trim them.

Well done! Now you can relax with your little buddy and enjoy the MOOsic!
