INKED CIRCUS TATTOO EXPO 2023

Event Requirements

A signed copy of this document must be returned to Health.Inspectors@york.ca by **April 14, 2023**. Please note that the vendor application forms are due by **March 28, 2023**. Anyone providing a personal service (e.g., tattoo, piercing) must comply with the O.Reg 136/18: Personal Service Settings and must review and follow the requirements outlined:

Hand Hygiene

- Practice frequent and proper hand hygiene (e.g., before and after each service, between tasks, before and after glove use, when hands get soiled and as often as necessary)
- Have adequate supply of alcohol-based hand rub (70-90% alcohol) with a Drug Identification Number (DIN) or Natural Product Number (NPN), that is used within the expiry date
- Have access to a handwash station that is fully supplied with potable water under pressure, liquid soap and disposable paper towels, and conveniently located in the service area

Equipment and Instruments - On-Site Sterilization is NOT ALLOWED

- Critical items (e.g., needles, tubes) are purchased pre-packaged single-use and sterile
 - Items purchased from a manufacturer are preferred over re-usable equipment that is sterilized off-site
- Items/equipment are kept sterile until point of use (damaged or wet packages cannot be used)
- Lot number and expiry date on pre-packaged single-use, sterile equipment is documented on the client record
- If re-usable equipment is sterilized off-site,
 - Provide location where sterilization took place and copies of last three (3) spore test results for the sterilizer(s)/autoclave(s) available (must be in English)
 - o Packaged, sterile items must be labelled with the date of sterilization
 - A covered puncture-resistant, leak-proof container labelled "Dirty items Do Not Use" available (to store and transport used equipment to off-site sterilization location)
- For cartridge systems with no membrane or proof of membrane, the grip sleeves and drive bars
 will be required to be sterile prior to use and between uses. This will require an adequate supply
 of sterile grip sleeves and drive bars to operate as sterilization is not permitted at the event
- Where needle cartridges equipped with a back flow prevention membrane or barrier, manufacturer proof of membrane required
- Use disposable covers for equipment that cannot be disinfected between clients

Machines and cords must be fully covered with a disposable plastic cover. This includes the use
of single-use tape to secure the cover. The cover and tape must be discarded between clients
and the grip wiped with an intermediate level disinfectant

Environment

• Contact surfaces (counters, trays, tables and chairs/beds) have a smooth and non-absorbent finish that can be easily cleaned and disinfected

Sharps and Garbage Disposal

- Dispose sharps in an CSA approved, adequately sized sharps container available
 - Sharps containers that are full/partly filled must not be left unattended, even when the event is not in operation (i.e., overnight hours)
- Use an appropriate garbage receptacle (covered and lined) and empty regularly

Cleaning & Disinfection

- Have access to a dedicated reprocessing sink to clean and disinfect semi- and non- critical items between use during the event
 - The reprocessing sink cannot be located in a washroom/service area, cannot be the handwash sink, must be large enough to submerge largest piece of equipment that requires cleaning and disinfection on-site, continuously supplied with potable hot and cold running water under pressure, and has adequate counter space to prepare the reusable equipment for use and re-use
- Spray/squeeze bottles for distilled water must be cleaned and disinfected prior to first use and before refills in a dedicated reprocessing sink. Additional spray/squeeze bottles may be necessary for the event
- Disposable ink caps disinfected before use
- Use appropriate surface disinfectant(s) with a DIN or NPN. Surfaces are disinfected between clients

Health and Safety

- Skin antiseptic available
- Dressings (sterile preferred) intended to cover wounds and approved for human skin available
- No eating or drinking while providing service
- Personal protective equipment, such as disposable gloves, are available
- York Region Public Health continues to strongly recommend the use of masks in the three 3Cs

 confined spaces, crowds or in close contact with someone, especially if they are vulnerable or immunocompromised

Information for Clients

- Provide an explanation of the invasive procedure, including information about risks to all clients
- Provide both verbal and written after-care information to all clients

Records

- Client records kept by the service provider for a minimum of three (3) years (stored in accordance with the applicable privacy legislation)
- Accidental blood and body fluid exposures documented

The following services are PROHIBITED at the event:

- Scleral tattooing, implantation of eye jewellery under the conjunctiva
- For tattooing, Health Canada does not recommend the use of human ashes
