




HOW TO MEASURE YOUR FURNITURE

We know it is not as exciting as picking out your new piece of furniture, but to ensure your new piece fits it into your home it is your responsibility to measure your furniture and your space to ensure your piece makes it into your home!

YOUR SPACE Establish the best delivery pathway into your home from the outside to the exact location your furniture will be placed. The space and entry should be measured for fit and accessibility considering elevators, hallways, corners, stairways, doorways, banisters, drop ceilings, light fixtures, and bulkheads.









HALLWAYS + CORNERS CLEARANCE STAIRWAYS, BULKHEADS, DROP CEILINGS + FIXTURES

YOUR FURNITURE Establish if your new piece will fit into its final location. Use painters tape to map out where it will end up. Having the furniture's dimensions will also determine if it will through your established delivery path. The Height (H), Width (W), and Depth (D) are important measurements and should not be overlooked. Another important dimension is the Diagonal (DI). This measurement allows for maneuvering of the furniture through corners and doorways. Remember to measure all attached parts of the furniture – in some cases the legs may be removed but most of the time they are permanently attached.
