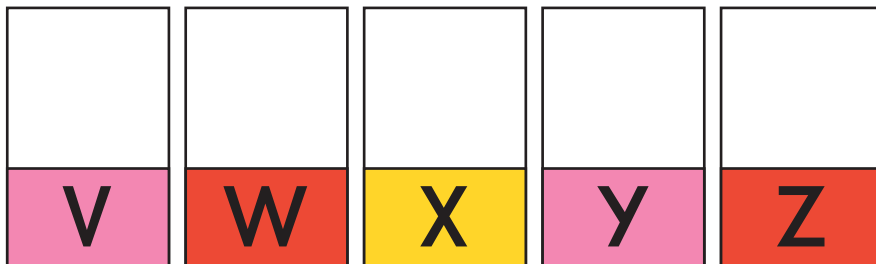
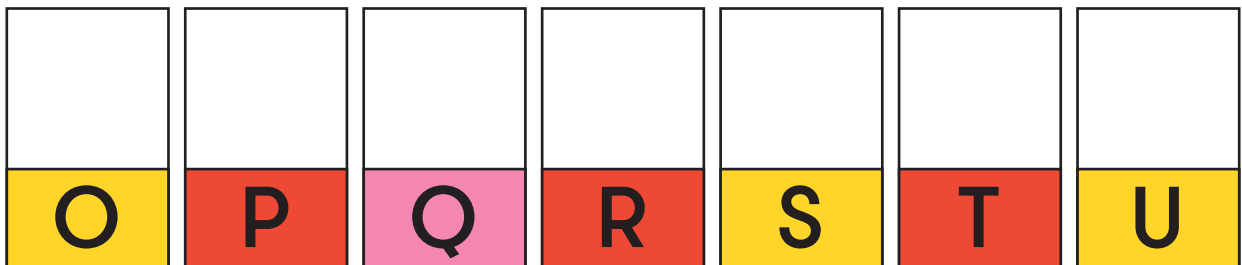
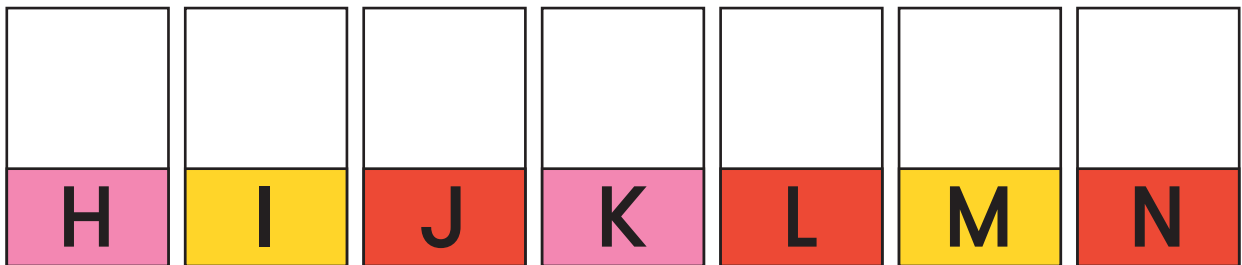
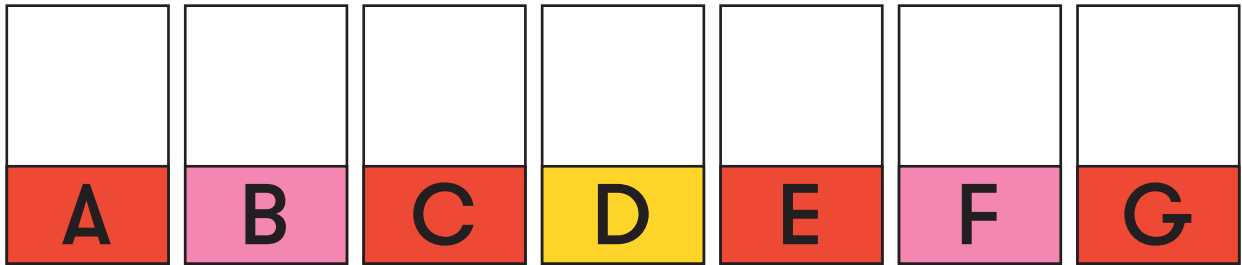


Top Secret Code

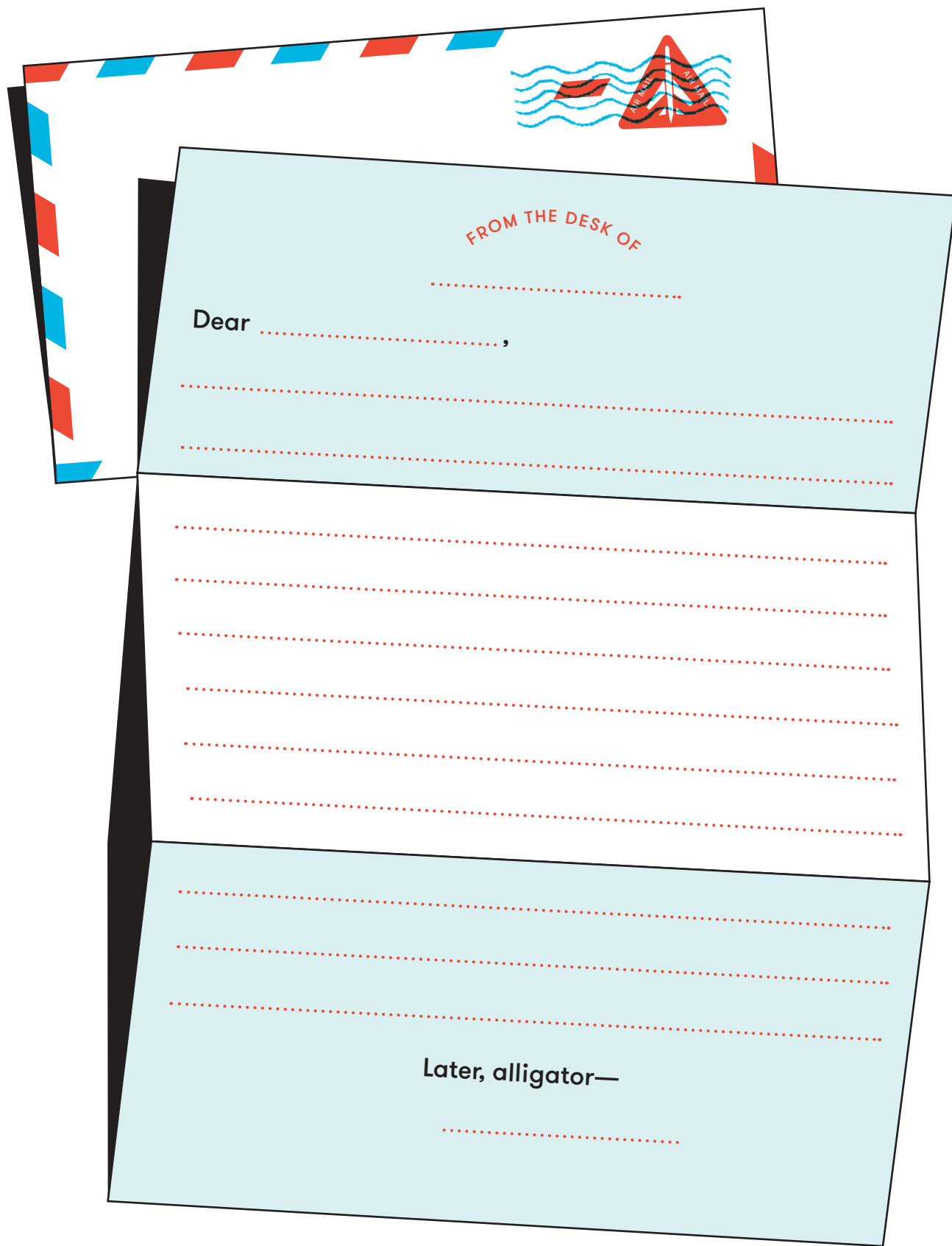
Can you write in code?

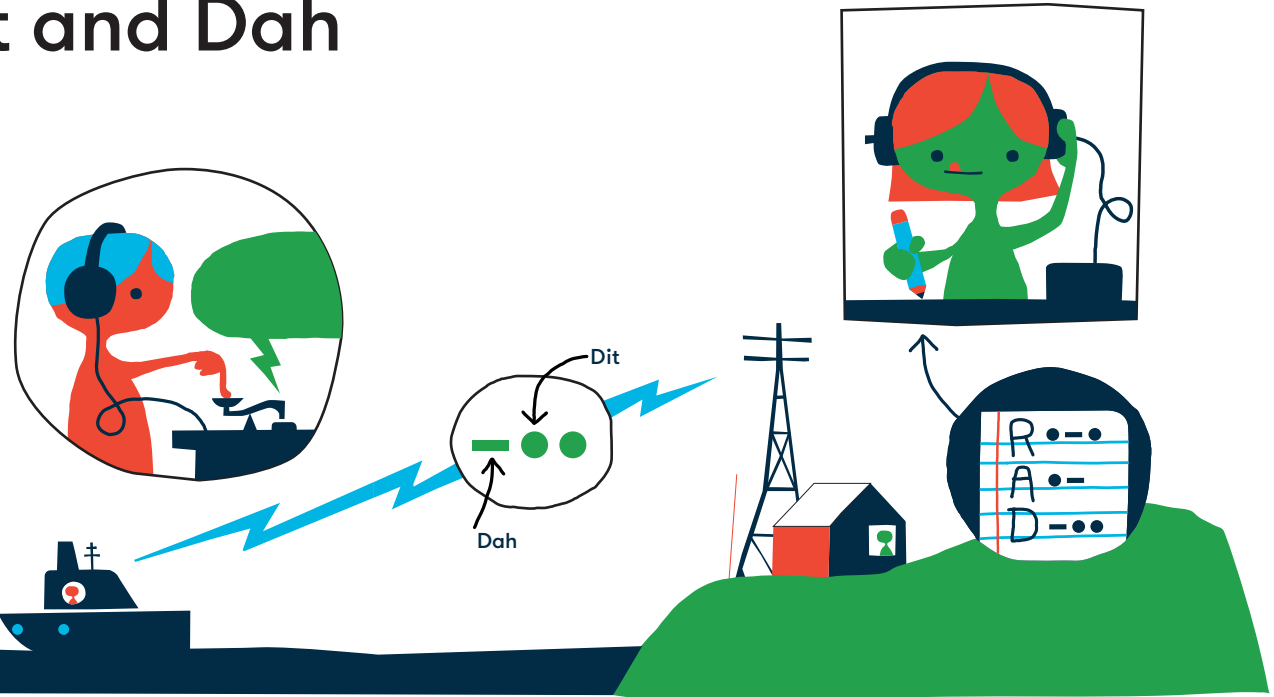


Morse Code: Dit and Dah

Before the telephone or email was invented, the Morse code allowed people to communicate long distances almost instantly by electric telegraph.

How it works

By tapping out messages using the code, electrical signals are transmitted over a wire. On the other end, a receiver beeps out the code, and operators can translate the message.
