



Coloring on Fabric

There are many types of fabric paint and fabric markers available to use. But, another alternative is to use regular crayons or colored pencils. Crayons and colored pencils can give you more of a blended softer watercolor appearance. The following techniques will make crayon or colored pencils color fast with gentle minimal washings only. I would not recommend it for something that is repeatedly washed as the color will slowly fade.

In using any types of coloring, be sure to test on a sample of your fabric and wash before coloring on your final design. Different fabric can react differently. My sample designs are done on regular white cotton fabric.

Crayons

Crayons can be used to color on fabric just the same as if you are using paper. You can blend colors together, shade, etc. Just remember to smooth all colors, if there are dark streaks, lines in your coloring, there will be dark streaks and/or lines in your finished design.

Color your design as you want. When finished, with a hot iron press your design face up but completely cover the design with a paper towel. Iron directly over the paper towel. This will help to set the crayon colors but more importantly it will remove the wax from the crayons.

Colored Pencils

Colored pencils can also be used to color on fabric. You can blend multiple colors, just remember that if you leave lines/streaks in the colors it will remain that way when finished.

Color your design as you want. When finished, using a small paint brush or q-tip, apply a complete but light coating of fabric painting medium over the colored area. You will want to completely dampen the colored area without it being too heavy. Keep in mind that applying this medium will help set the color but may also stiffen the fabric.

Gentle wash, dry and press with a hot iron.

I used fabric painting medium by Americana, but there are several brands available.
