

Printable finger sizer

HOW TO USE THE RING SIZER

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Check that the line below measures 5cm on your ruler.



If not, the page has not printed correctly.

Ensure that scaling is set to 'None' or 'Do Not Scale' in the print dialog box.

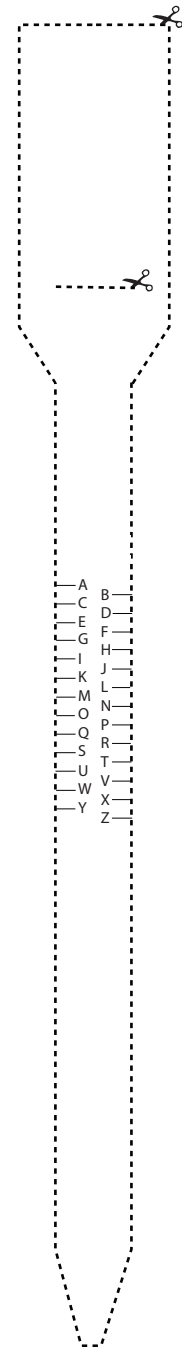
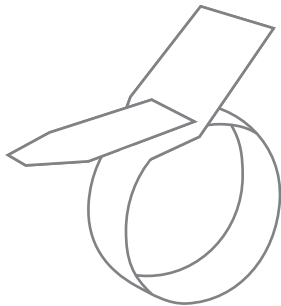
Carefully cut out the ring sizer template.

Make a slot on the wide end.

Slide the end of the ring sizer through the slot to make a loop.

Read the letter size on the scale.

Please note: this is a guide only.



MEASURING YOUR FINGER

The ring should fit your finger comfortably. It should be snug enough so that it will not fall off, but loose enough to slide over your knuckle.

Finger size also changes depending on the time of day and the weather.

For more accurate results measure your finger size:

1. At the end of the day and when your fingers are warm. Fingers are generally smaller in the early morning and when its cold.
2. Measure finger size 3 to 4 times to eliminate any unusual readings.

This method will result in a close approximation, there is always the risk that your measurement will be slightly off.
