## Do You Fancy A Party?

A party is a fun and games event where people mix for sparkling conversation, good food and laughter. Parties tend to be informal and hosts do not go to extra trouble to decorate. While party games were once wildly popular, there are groupswho do not enjoy a lot of organized activity. It should be a highly enjoyable experience. The activities should fit the needs of the guests.

Sometimes parties do not have to be planned at all. A larger party requiresgood planning to handle the program, publicity, decorating, welc oming, refreshments and clean up. ## Work With A Fancy Schmancy Team

Choose a small leadership team to complete all advance a rangements. The team may be asfew asthree oraslarge asten or more. Divide ta sks between team members and trust them to finish their tasks. While the leadership may be divided, one person should be in charge to keep the whole affair moving smoothly.

## Fancy Schmancy Organization

Follow oursuggestionsadding your own creativity at the beginning of the planning process. Write down exactly what will happen a nd when the jobs must be completed. Do not leave organization to the last minute. Ministries

## Purchase Supplies As Needed

Decide what the banquet budget is and stay within the limit. Keep expense records. Use the church tax exemption number.

## Practice a Positive Approach

Maintain a light and happy atmosphere during the planning process. If your attitude is right, the rest of your team will catch the spint. After all, this is a party!

## Pray!

Pray for the event, the team and the guests. Pray as a team. Take each detail before the Lord and then-Relax!

## Set Up

Provid e a dequate time to set up tables, decorations, props, food and other items necessary forthe event. Reserve the church forthe entire day and there may be situa tionswhen room a rangements must take place a day before the party.

## Say Thank You

The behind-the-scenes team is the core of this event. Take time to write thank you notes, call and give small thank you gifts. Recognize your team publically at the banquet.

## Clean Up

When the event is over, clean up begins. The party is not complete until the church is in order. Encourage the team to remove theirprops immediately. Stay to help with kitchen clean up.

## A Fancy Schmancy Speaker

## Invite A Speaker

By all means invite a special person to share inspirational thoughts. When using a speaker, consider reducing program segments we provide that are best performed by the guests themselves. The speaker should conclude the evening festivities.

## The Perfect Person

A good speakermakesa faith connection with the specific group. Choose the speaker from a list of possibilities suggested by friends, relatives, pastor, other churches, community groups or national organizations.


## Consider the Cost

Speaking feesare part of the banquet budget. Ask the speaker if she hasa set fee. If not, give a generousmonetary gift including traveling costs. Think about the time they invest in preparation, travel and presentation.

## Give Specific Instructions

Send a letter, make a telephone call and stay in contact through the intemet. Include information like highway directions, a mival time a nd place, group size, time limit, lodging information a nd other personal details.

Tell the speaker the type of program and details of what you would like their speech in include. Continue to make contact periodically until the speaker leaves home to travel to the event

## Care and Feeding Of The Speaker

Assign a pre-a ranged hostess "friend" to handle introduction, sit and converse with the guest at dinner to give the speaker a sense of belonging.

Be aware that it is disquieting for a speaker to enter a room of strangers, be expected to speak about personal issues a nd leave still feeling as if everyone is a stranger.

Pay all expenses from the time the speaker leaves their home until they retum. If more meals are required, host orpay accordingly.

## After The Banquet

Pay promptly. Stay with the speakeruntil they leave to retum to their home. Thank them from your heart and always follow up with a handwritten tha nk you note.

## Shouting Out...

## It's DeLovely!

Because you make the effort of preparing a lovely event, filled with fun, fellowship and great food, go the extra mile to public ize. Let's face it, you have to have women come so
 do your best to convince them it will be a unique experience in fine dining.

## It's All About The Fancy!

Invitations, posters, registration foms, programs, ha ndouts and centerpiece should all relate to your theme. Use the same colors, scripture, picture or logo on every piece of publicity.

## Fancy Every Gal!

Send invitations to everyone in your church. If a community wide event is desired, place posters in local resta urants, businesses, offices. Insert invitations in the weekly worship folder and in the monthly newsletter.

Don't forget...one of the best places to put posters is in the Ladies Room at church and in community businesses. If a local business hesita testo put a nother poster in theirwindow, suggest this"out of the way" place!

## Create Buzz!

Involve lots of people in the planning stages. They don't have to be on the team but delegate tasksorsmall parts. Ask asmany people as possible to participate in the formalprogram. No memorization. They read theirpart. The benefit? Everyone who isinvolved will attend and will be more likely to talk about the event and invite others. Many hands make light work. Cut stress with more help.

## Wanna Have More Fancy Fun?

Let guests know prizes will be a warded forvanious games. Ask guests to weartheir favorite "fancy" jewelry. Tell stories around the tables about the jewelry. Choose a few gals to judge a jewelly contest casually throughout the evening. Award a prize to the fanciest jewelry....first, second and third prizes make it even more fun!

## Be Creative!

If the banquet is a round a holiday like Mother's Day, advertise the event to the men of the church that this is a great Mother's Day gift they can give their wives and mothers. Find creative ways to make your banquet a "gift" to the women who attend.

## Puttin' On The Ritz!



Create a simple, elegant decor. When guests enter the party area, they should see and feel the theme immediately. Discuss decoration at the beginning of the planning process. Follow oursuggestionsorinvent your own fancy elegance.

Ourtipsare meant to spark yourown creativity. Read a nd follow directions but use items that are available locally. Not every decoration listed must be used.

Choose the best and leave the rest!

## How Complicated Is This Going To Be?

Thisevent can be assimple orinvolved as desired. If there are folks in yourchurch who love to decorate, give them the responsibility to tum the room into a work of art. If no one comesforward, decorate simply at each table.

## What Should Be Decorated?

Decorate tables with centepieces and theme related items. Considerdec orating the tic kettable, the program area and fourwalls of the large room.

## Tasteful, Stunning and Sublime

Rememberfancy and elegant means "less is more". Choose a few lovely pieces to make the room come to life with divine sparkle.
Read the list of suggestionsa nd choose what worksforyourgang and your budget.

## Tables

1. White on White on White: This is probably the most elegant of all designs. White cloth table coverings, clear glass huric a ne lantems with white sand and white pillarcandle, crystal accessories.
....one small white painted birdhouse
....white ceramic birds
....one white painted pine cone
....white na pkinstied with white ribbon, white silk flowertucked inside
....white dishes, cups, saucers, clear stemmed water glasses
....sprinkle just a little bit of white/clearglitter on the table
2. Pastels: C hoose very pale colors like pale green, pink a nd blue. Mix and match so every table has every color. Pastel table coverings, flower ba sket centerpieces. Choose live green leaf plants and tuck pastel silk flowers into the dirt.
....tea light candles at each place setting in small glasscups. Choose one pastel tea light color pertable.
....white napkinstied with twine, pastel silk flower tucked in twine
....white dishes, cups, saucers, clear stemmed water glasses
....pastel colored glass pebbles scattered nearcenterpiece
3. Gold on Yellow: Each table covering is pale yellow. Use yellow silk rosesorwhite silk daisies in centerpieces. J ust the flowerheadstucked inside a tall glass vase or humicane lantem look lovely. In fact, mix yellow roses and white daisies in the same container.
....tall yellow candlesgrouped nearthe flowers in gold candle holders
....white napkinstied with wide gold ribbon
....white silk flower, brush white glue on tips of flower, sprinkle gold glitter onto glue and let dry.
....spray paint pebbles with gold spray paint, scatter on table
4. Silver on Black on White: Each table covering is pale gray (silver). Spray paint small craft boxes glossy black forcenterpieces. Add one white or silver pillar candle. Fill box with white flowers, tipped in silver glitter with white glue. Trim with black ribbon bows. Place centerpiece on silver tray or mirror.
....blacknapkinstied with silver ribbon, pale pink silk flower, brush white glue on tips of flower, sprinkle silver glitter onto glue and let dry. ....scatter faux pearls/pearl necklaces on table
5. Tiffany Blue: "Breakfast At Tiffany's". Choose the Tiffany blue color fortable coverings. Add groupingsof white candles in crystal candle holders, bowls or vases. Intertwine beautiful white ribbon and small jewelry boxes spray painted Tiffany blue and tied with white ribbons.
....white napkins tied with white ribbon, white silk flower
....silver and pearl costume jewelry scattered on table
....white formal gloves and evening purse draped nearcandles
There are many da zzling coloroptions. Choose one that you know will delight your group. Stay within the same color family for a more elegant appearance.

## PIEAS Serving Tables

If the dinner is a buffet, place items in the same colors on the serving tables. Scatter items along the length of the table. Flower buds, ribbon, glitter, ceramic pieces, etc. will be follow through to the theme.

## Table Gifts

It'salwaysthoughtful to offertable favors. Choose something small to place at each place setting. Tiny white ceramic birds, candles, silver charms, candy box or other items matching the theme.

## Stage Presentation

Feature lovely, elegant itemson the stage orat one end of the room. Make the display lovely to look at by using beautiful antique items loa ned by friends, relatives a nd church members.

To make the display unified, cover small tables, boxes, stands with large white bed sheets. Scatter white twinkle lights that will show through the fabric. This creates eye appealing multi levels.

Display at least two orthree fancy lamps. These extra lights will shine down on crystal, jewelry orquilt fabrics. Request a variety of items so the display will be interesting to view. The result will be unique and personal to your group depending on what people own and are willing to share.

## Background Music

Play music as guests enter and throughout dinner. Take into consideration the fact that conversations will be taking place. CD/C assette volume should be carefully controlled. Play music at the end of the evening as guests are gathering their belongs.

Consider music from a specific time period. The big bands of the 1940's still offer beautiful sounds with an upbeat tempo. Look at www.Amazon.com to find bands like Artie Shaw and His Orchestra. Frank Sinatra tunes, smooth jaz, Christian jazz and classic al pieces.

Live music is always appropriate and fun. Ask a pianist, organist, ha rpist, small jazz group, classic al string quartet, college orhigh school musiciansto participate. Be prepared to feed them and offera small honorarium.

## Art Supplies, Decorations, Small Gifts

Use resources available in your community. Check out craft shops, party stores, discount stores and rummage shops. Make table decorations, programs and table gifts. Check the Intemet for fun, affordable items.

DoorPizes: Askif businessesand restaurantsare willing to donate gifts or gift cards. Buy small, lovely items like picture frames, note holders, lamps, make up bags, pill organizers, tea cups, key chains, potted plants, candles, stuffed animals a nd costume jewelry.

Find inexpensive itemsthat are appealing to the feminine eye. Gifts are not necessary but often make the event special and fun forthose who attend.

If young children are present, include toy gifts that charm them. Stuffed a nimals, coloring books, jewelry a nd books are great choices.

## Splendiforous Ambiance!

Consider crowd psychology. No one enjoys going to a party where everyone remains a stranger, little conversation occurs and a subdued mood becomes awkward. Everyone enjoys an event where people are talking and laughing, light and temperature are controlled, music sets the mood, strangersare just new friendsand tablesare inviting.

## When The First Person Arrives, The Party Has Started

Greet guestscordially, give them a name tag and direct them to the party area. Ifspecial litemsare on display, encourage gueststo travel from spot to spot as the crowd gathers. They may examine table decorations. Help them choose a place to sit or find their assigned table and specific seat. Point out rest roomsand convenienceswithin the building. Keep guests out of the kitc hen!!!

## Get Acquainted

Put people at ease with smiles and hospitality. Help them get acquainted with simple table activities. Place conversation starters under each plate. Scatter pens or pencils at each table and place paper puzzes or short games in obvious places so guests can work together to win a table prize.

## Getting Together

Help the guests "sense the whole". Enthusiastic group singing encourages togethemess and so do mixers.

## Small Groups

Place guests in small groups and offer opportunities to make more intimate contact with others. Devise an activity that could be done in pairs or fours. Dividing by birth months is an effective way of creating smaller groups a cross all lines: a ge, color, sex.

## Alternate The Pace

Some activities might be interactive and some quiet. Have some activities requiring a mental challenge with pencil and paper, group skits and sometimes activities for the whole group.

## Build Toward A Climax

Complete a few exc iting activitiesjust before dinnera nd continue the fun after the meal.

## Close With a Whole Group Activity

Do not end the evening with refreshments. Bring everyone together with a whole group activity. It could be singing, listening to a story, letting people tell what they enjoyed ora frankly spinitual closing with a serious skit or talk, songs, hymns, praise choruses, sharing and a benediction featuring a fellowship circle.

## Clean Up

Lea ve the church c lea nerthan you found it. Often those enjoying the fun are asked to help clean up. That can be fun and don't forget "many hands make light work".

Tip: Keep the music playing through clean up. Ta ke a moment to sing and dance with other workers! Ministries

## Get Your Glam On....

# Bonjour! <br> (Everything Sounds Better in French!) 

Welcome Fancy Schmancy guestsin an area where they are royally welcomed and treated to deliciouschilled punch (Make our recipe or serve your personal favorite beverage) while coats are removed and table seating is confirmed.

Make this a delightful treat by serving a delicious cold beverage in crystal punch bowlswith crystal cups. Consider serving sma ll a p petizers on silver
 trays. Add color coordinated beverage napkins.

Cover the punch table in white linen and fill the table with lovely silk flowers a nd candles.

Play soft background music as guests begin a riving one half hour before the banquet begins. Encourage them to enterthe hall where they roam from table to table and enjoy the "fancy" table decorations and staged display.

## Pink Paradise Punch

1/3 cup Kool-Aid Chery FlavorSugar-Sweetened Soft Drink Mix 1/3 cup Kool-Aid Tropical Punch Flavor Sugar-Sweetened Soft Drink Mix 1-1/2 qt. (6 cups) cold water
1 pint (2 cups) vanilla ice cream, softened 1 bottle (1 liter) carbonated lemon-lime beverage, chilled

PLACE soft drink mixes in punch bowl. Add water, stir until drink mixes are dissolved. Add ice cream; stir until melted. Refrigerate until ready to serve. STR in carbonated beverage just before serving.

## The Butler!

Ask several men (any age) to become butlers.
 Their task is to serve the ladies in any helpful way as the event progresses.

FYI (For Your Information): Butlers are the aristocrats of servants. In fiction and film, the butlerisoften portrayed as guardian of tradition and protocol who caters to his ladyship's every wish. He has a hospitality mind set and anticipates what is needed. A butler is a man servant responsible for food service, silverware and the deportment of other servants.

## Butlers dress in white shirts, black bow ties (or regular ties), black dress slacks and dress shoes. If one or more own tuxedos, all the better!

Greet guestsformally with a rms down at sides. Bow slightly with a quick, stiff bow. Hand them a program as they enter the hall.

Butlers cary silver trays filled with appetizers, beverage and napkins. As guests gather, the butlers mingle with the gathering group, approach and politely offer an appetizer. Assist with seating as guests a pproach tables.
"Would Madame enjoy an appetizer?"
"Mayl help you with yourcoat, Ma'am?"
"Allow me to assist you."
"Allow me to take that for you."
"Very good, Madame."
When cupsare empty, place them on the silvertraysand retum them to the kitchen. Always be aware of the needs of the guests.

Butlers are formal and do not enter into casual conversation. They are unobtrusive, serve quietly and disa ppearonly to retum to serve once more.

Butlers become table servers during the banquet meal. The same formal tone should be caried through the meal. Offer coffee and dessert and whisk away dirty dishes as quickly and quietly as possible.

Ask the men of the/church to cook and serve or consider local caterers! Ask a local Boy Scout troop. They often look for community service projects.

Conversations are a prionity so play CD's softly as a pleasant diversion, setting a fancy mood for the event. Carefully control the volume.

Does your community have amateur/professional musicians willing to attend? Think about asking a violinist, guitarist, hapist, pianist or ensemble to perform as guests a rive and as they enjoy dinner.

Sing fun songs and Christia $n$ choruses after dinner. Ask a pianist to accompany the group. Choose familiarsongs. Ministries
