





Follow our tips and add your creative touches to make 'Hat's Enough' a unique event that will be remembered for years. Manage arrangements and then develop the delightful 'Hat-Titude' theme.

From the first moment your committee meets until the last note of music and the final crystal cup is tucked away, capture the imagination of every girl from three to ninety three! ...or ninety four!

Smiles and sweet tears are proof that your gathering has been a success.

Attitude is a little thing Chat makes a big difference.

Prepare A Banquet Before Them!

A banquet is a party with food as the main attraction. Add a program, a speaker or local entertainment. The occasion is comfortable and social. The most popular tradition is the *Mother and Daughter Banquet*. There are other occasions when banquets are enjoyable. Evening events, women's programs, holiday gatherings, annual retreats, summer picnics and even father and child banquets.





...Or Create An Informal Gathering

A *Party* is a fun and games event where people mix for sparkling conversation, good food and laughter. Parties tend to be informal and hosts do not go to extra trouble to decorate. Sometimes parties do not have to be planned at all.

While party games were once wildly popular, there are groups who do not enjoy a lot of organized activity. Create a highly enjoyable experience. The activities should fit the needs of the guests.

A larger party requires detailed planning to handle the program, publicity, decorating, refreshments and clean up. It's a great party if you create your own fun and then remember the event fondly.


Pay Attention to Details

Often the smallest detail makes the biggest impression. Wild flowers on a table, small table gifts for each guest, background music, greeters at the door and other thoughtful gestures make individuals feel welcome, special and pampered.



Practice Christian Hospitality

Help guests grow in their understanding of the Lord. Everyone should be giving affection and receiving love from other Christians in the family of God. Begin friendly conversations, avoid gossip or mean spirited comments.



Set Realistic Goals

What do you want to happen during the hours your guests are with you? Be specific! Plans in this workbook are complete. Adapt details to fit your needs. Add creative ideas and change activities as desired.

Organize

Make changes at the beginning of the planning process. Write down exactly what will happen and when jobs must be completed. Do not leave organization to the last minute.

Work With A Team

Choose a small leadership team to complete advance arrangements. The team may be as few as two or as large as ten or more. Divide assignments between team members. Trust them to complete their tasks. While specific jobs may be divided, one person should be in charge to keep the whole affair moving smoothly.



Purchase Supplies As Needed

Stay within the limit of the banquet budget. Keep expense records. Use the church tax exemption number.

Practice A Positive Approach

Maintain a light and happy atmosphere during the planning process. If your attitude is right the rest of your team will catch the spirit. After all, this is a party!



Pray!

Pray for the event, the team and the guests. Pray as a team. Take each detail before the Lord and then-Relax

Set Up

Provide adequate time to set up tables, decorations, props and food. Reserve the church for the entire day. Sometimes room arrangements take place a day before the party.


Say Thank You

The behind-the-scenes team is the core of this event. Take time to write thank you notes, call and give small thank you gifts. Recognize your team publically at the banquet.

When the event is over, clean up begins. The party is not complete until the church is in order. Encourage the team to remove their props immediately. Stay to help with kitchen clean up.

Sparkling Guest Speaker

Invite A Speaker

Invite a guest to share inspirational thoughts. When scheduling a speaker, consider reducing program segments this program provides that are best performed by the guests themselves. The speaker should conclude the evening festivities.

The Perfect Person CHASE

A good speaker makes a faith connection with the group. Choose the speaker from a list of possibilities suggested by friends, relatives, pastor, other churches, community groups or national organizations.

Consider The Cost

Ask the speaker if there is a set fee. If not, give a generous monetary gift including traveling costs. Think about the time they invest in preparation, travel and presentation.







Specific Instructions

Send a letter, make a telephone call and stay in contact through the internet. Include highway directions, arrival time, group size, time limit, lodging information and specific personal details.

Tell the guest speaker the program theme. Include details of what you would like her talk to include. Make contact periodically until the speaker travels to the event.

Care and Feeding

It is disquieting for a guest to enter a room of strangers, be expected to speak about personal and spiritual issues and leave still feeling as if everyone is a stranger.

Assign a pre-arranged hostess "friend" to handle introductions, sit and converse with the guest at dinner to give the speaker a sense of belonging.

Include expenses from the time the speaker leaves home until she returns. If more meals are required, host or pay accordingly.

After The Banquet

Pay promptly. Stay with the guest speaker until she leaves to return home. Thank that person from your heart and follow up with a handwritten thank you note!

Publicity!

Let's face it, you need enthusiastic guests. Do your best to convince them it will be a unique experience in fine dining and entertainment. They must not miss it! Go the extra mile to publicize.



NOTEORUSE PLEA God Is In The Details

Invitations, posters, registration forms, programs, handouts and centerpieces should relate to your theme. Use the same colors, scripture, picture or logo on every piece of publicity.

Invite Every Gal!

Send invitations. If this is a community wide event, place posters in local restaurants, business offices. Insert invitations in the Sunday morning worship folder and in the monthly church newsletter.

Fun Tip: One of the best places to put posters is in the Ladies Room at church and in community businesses. If a local business hesitates to put yet another community event poster in their window, suggest their ladies room as a great "out of the way" place!

Add Some Fun! Ask guests to wear their favorite beautiful, sporty or outrageous hat. It's okay if they don't, but those who join in the fun will add 'hat-titude' to the event!

Create Buzz!

Involve lots of people in the planning stages. They don't have to be on the team but delegate tasks or small parts. Ask as many people as possible to participate in the formal program.

Everyone who is involved will attend and will be more likely to talk about the event and invite others. Many hands make light work. Cut stress with more help.

Even More Fun!

Let guests know if prizes will be awarded for various games. 'Gossip' about program and food to create excitement. Enjoy the company of friends.

Be Creative!

When the banquet is around Mother's Day, advertise the event to men of the church that the cost of this event is a great Mother's Day gift they can give their wives and mothers and daughters. Find creative ways to make your banquet a "gift" to women and girls who want to attend.

Create a 'world' filled with...HATS! Guests should immediately see and feel the feminine hat theme. Discuss decoration at the beginning of the planning process. We offer many suggestions to get you started. Trust your own creativity and make your 'Hat's Enough' banquet amazing! Choose the best of our ideas and leave the rest for another day.

How Complicated Is This Going to Be?

This spring banquet can be simple or over the top beautiful. Give artistic, visually creative people the responsibility to turn the room into a work of art. If no one comes forward, decorate simply at each table. You cannot go wrong! Make it fun!



What Should Be Decorated?

Decorate tables with centerpieces and color co-ordinated related items. Consider decorating the welcome table, entry door, stage area and each corner.

Tasteful Elegance

Remember: Less is more. Do not clutter with an overabundance of 'stuff'. Choose a few unique accessories to make the tables and room come to life.

Decorate

Everything in the room, from table decorations to staging displays, should feature the hat theme. Individual local events will look different depending upon items available.

The best fun is when guests arrive and the hat theme comes to life with table elegance, games, speakers, prizes and music!

Allow guests to view the table decorations before they are seated.

Keep it simple. The task will be easier and the result will be a delight to the eye. Become familiar with the available space and set up accordingly. Use color, sparkle and light to its' best advantage.

Collect as many different hats as possible. Place one or two hats in the center of each table. If antique hat boxes are available, place the hat on top of the box. Add accessories. Consider decorating options based on available items.

COLOR: Choose coordinating colors for a basic foundation. This can be as bright as neon orange or as restrained as ivory or white. Print programs in the same color or a complimentary color. Add sparkle with candles, balloons, crystal glasses and color coordinated napkins.

Hat's Enough

BEAUTIFUL TOUCHES: Make tables interesting by adding small personal touches that catch the eye. It could be antique crystal candlesticks with bows, figurines in hats, old eyeglasses, gloves, scarves or live flowers. Fly balloons high over each table in bunches.

MORE FUN IDEAS: Add one artificial flower on top of the napkin setting. For a touch of whimsey wrap a beaded bracelet around the napkin. Make small paper hats in bright colored paper. Place one small hat at each plate.

FORGET THE CLUTTER: Use items sparingly. Don't try to do it all on each table!





ELEGANT HATS: Check out the local theater wardrobe room, Good Will shop or closet to find old hats. The hats can be from any era. They can be a delightful variety of Victorian, mid 20th century and modern hats. Sport caps, work hats, nurse's caps and others look great when gathered in the area. One or two hats placed in the center of each table with a few interesting accessories around them looks great.


CONTEMPORARY STUNNER: Arrange three tall glass vases for each table. Square or rectangle shapes are great but use what is available. Spray paint tree twigs white and stick them in vases that have been half filled with white salt or sand. Fold small triangle shaped paper hats in various colors and place them on the twigs.

BALLOON BLAST: Fly color coordinated balloons high from the centers of each table. The entire room will look festive as guests enter. Fill the floor with balloons. Don't worry, balloons move easily as people walk. The more balloons on the floor, the better the effect.

DESSERT TOWER: The centerpiece of each table can become **dessert!** Bake round layer cakes and decorate them to resemble top hats. The cakes should serve the number of people at each table.

The tables are the featured 'stars' of the party.

Add accessories as available.

Program Props

If props are needed, they should be set up for the after dinner program. See the program for prop information. Sometimes nothing is needed.

Vintage Hat Stands: Borrow as many old free standing hat stands as possible. Place them across the stage. Place hats of all kinds on the stands. The more varied the better. Hang a sign on one stand: HOME IS WHERE YOU HANG YOUR HAT!

NOT FOR USE

Lighting: Between the hat stands, place a variety of cozy floor lights to feature the hats with light.

Photo Booth

Want some laughter filled entertainment? Collect interesting hats, long necklaces, gloves and scarves. Decorate a simple background and provide chairs or a bench in the scene. Gather anything crazy and fun to wear.

Photographer: Ask one person to take digital pictures. Guests may use their own cameras and cell phones to take pictures. Guests have their pictures taken alone or in groupings of their choice. They can choose whatever items they want to wear or may use the hat they wear to the event. Make photos available as desired.

Art Supplies, Decorations, Small Gifts

Shop craft and party stores, discount stores and rummage shops. Make table decorations, programs and table gifts. Check the internet for affordable, interesting items.

Creative Table Favor and Dessert: Make chocolate chip cookies and display them at each place setting in old teacups and saucers. These old cups and saucers can be collected from Good Will, Salvation Army and donated by friends. To make the many varieties of cups and saucers look similar, attach a large bow to the handle of each cup. The cup and saucer become the take home favor of the event.

Place each dessert inside a clear glass canning jar.
Trim the top of each jar with a ribbon and bow.
Tuck a fancy chocolate lollipop into each ribbon.
Take home gifts are always a popular 'ooo-ahh' factor for any banquet!

Door Prizes: Ask businesses and restaurants to donate gifts or gift cards. Buy dollar items like picture frames, note holders, lamps, cosmetic bags, pill organizers, key chains, potted plants, candles and costume jewelry to give away if playing table games. Don't forget to provide something fun for the littlest gals....stuffed animals, coloring books or fingernail polish!

Put everyone's banquet ticket in a large fish bowl and draw their tickets at random. They may come and choose a gift or the gifts can be numbers and given away in order of the drawing.

PREVI Consider crowd psychology

Everyone enjoys an event where people are talking and laughing, light and temperature are controlled, music sets the mood, strangers are new friends and tables are inviting. No one enjoys going to a party where people remain strangers, little conversation occurs and a subdued mood becomes awkward.

When the First Person Arrives,

The Party Has Started

Greet guests cordially, give name tags and direct them to the party area. Encourage guests to browse the table decorations as the crowd gathers. Help them choose a seat or find their assigned table. Point out rest rooms and conveniences. Keep guests out of the kitchen!!!



Get Acquainted



Put people at ease with generous hospitality and smiles. Get acquainted with simple table activities. Place conversation starters under a few plates. Scatter pens or pencils and place paper puzzles or short games in obvious places so guests can work together to win a table prize.

Getting Together

Help the guests "sense the whole". Enthusiastic group singing encourages togetherness. Play a few table games as ice breakers.

Small Groups

Place guests in small groups and offer opportunities to make more intimate contact with others. Devise an activity that could be done in pairs or fours.

Alternate The Pace

Activities may be interactive or quiet. Create activities requiring a mental challenge with pencil and paper, group skits and some activities for the whole group.

Build Toward A Conclusion

Complete exciting activities just before dinner. Continue the fun after the meal. Add spiritually inspirational thoughts near the end.

Close With A Group Activity

End the event with a whole group activity. It could be singing or an inspirational spiritual closing with a serious skit or talk, songs, hymns, praise choruses, sharing and a benediction featuring a fellowship prayer circle.


Leave the church cleaner than you found it. Often those enjoying the fun are asked to help clean up. That can be fun and don't forget, "Many hands make light work".

A Warm Welcome!

"He who is of a merry heart has a continual feast."

Proverbs 15:15b

Serve a delicious chilled punch while guests gather, coats are removed and table seating is confirmed.

Make this a delightful formal treat by serving the delicious cold beverage in crystal punch bowls with crystal cups. Consider serving mini appetizers on beautiful plates. Add colorful beverage napkins.

Play soft background music. Encourage guests to enter the **banquet area** where they move from table to table and enjoy the decorations and staged displays.

Raspberry Sherbet Pink Punch

1 can frozen pink lemonade concentrate
2 ½ cans water
2 liter Sprite
1 container of raspberry sherbet

- 1. In a pitcher, combine pink lemonade concentrate and cans of water.
 - 2. Freeze for about 4 hours until slushy.
 - 3. In the pitcher, add the lemons and thick layer of raspberry sherbet.
 - 4. Pour Sprite over top of sherbet and stir just a bit so it gets nice and frothy on top.
 - 5. Serve immediately

Choose appetizers that fit your group.

Because guests may be standing
while juggling a beverage and appetizer, prepare finger foods.

Use one of our suggestions or create your own appetizer.

Fresh Fruit 'Cupcake'

Choose a variety of fresh fruits cut into small portions and placed in a doubled cupcake liner. The best fruit can be picked up with fingers for easy eating. Include a mixture of apple slice, cherry, diced cantaloupe, mini pineapple slice, banana, strawberries, blueberries.

Yummy Fruit Dip: 8 oz. Whipped Topping, 3 oz. Cream cheese, 7 oz. Marshmallow creme. Spoon into bottom of liner and fill with **fruit**.

Nuts And Bolts Party Mix

2 C. Corn Chex 2 C. Rice Chex 2 C. Cheerios 2 C. Thin pretzels 2 C. Blanched peanuts
3 T. Salad oil 10 T. Butter 4 T. Worcestershire Sauce
½ t. seasoned salt ½ t. garlic powder

Oven: 225 degrees In baking dish, mix cereals, pretzels, peanuts together; set aside. On medium head blend oil, butter, sauce, salt, garlic until butter is melted and spices are blended in. Pour seasoning mixture over cereal mixture and stir until completely coated with seasoning.

Bake 1½ hours, stirring every 20 minutes to make sure it does not burn.

Remove from oven and cool completely before storing in an airtight container. Fill doubled cupcake liners with individual portions of the Party Mix before guests arrive.

Crunchy Veggie Freat

Cut mini celery, cucumber slices, broccoli, cauliflower, asparagus, dilly beans and carrot sticks that fit into doubled cupcake liners. Spoon Ranch Dip into the liners before placing veggies on top. Choose veggies that can be cut into small pieces for easy dipping.

Ham and Eurkey Roll Ups

Roll deli ham and turkey and place upright in ranch dip with parsley or celery tops for garnish.

Shrimp

Spoon cocktail sauce into liner and place one shrimp on top. Option: For children, consider one chicken nugget on top of ketchup.

Fish Stick

Tartar sauce and one fish stick cut in half with carrot stick and mini dill pickle slice.

Mexican Fun

Fill cup with refried beans, shredded lettuce, diced tomatoes and top with sour cream. No spoon, just dip with the taco chips.

Pretzel Fun

Mini pretzels with mustard sauce.

Boneless Wings

Spoon a little bit of BBQ Sauce into liner and top with one or two boneless chicken wings.

Chili Cups

Spoon Chili into small plastic cups and top with two Ritz Crackers. Sour cream on top.

Plan Accordingly!

Assign a kitchen team to prepare the meal. Since this is a special event for the gals, it doesn't seem fair to ask them to cook their own food. Ask the men of the church to cook and serve or consider hiring local caterers! Ask a local Boy Scout troop to help serve the meal. They often look for community projects.

How about decking out the servers in large newspaper folded hats? The paper hats can be trimmed or left in original colors. OR, let the servers choose their own interesting hat!

What Should We Eat?

Here are a few menu options to get you started. Consider the cost, the theme, the effort involved to make the food and the tastes of the group.

Create a separate menu for children under age 12. Communicate the child friendly choices when guests are making their reservations.

SECOND LAYER: 1 (8 oz.) Cream cheese (softened), 1 C. Cool whip, 1 C. Powdered sugar. Use mixer to blend well. Spread over cooled First layer.

THIRD LAYER: 3 C. Milk. 1 small box instant chocolate pudding, 1 small box instant vanilla pudding. Using mixer, blend all together until thick and spread over Second layer.

FOURTH LAYER: Top with Cool Whip. Drizzle with chocolate and sprinkle more chopped nuts.

Sit back and wait for the oo's, aah's and compliments.

Strawberry Delight

Make an angel food cake. Add fresh strawberries and real whipping cream. Garnish with Cut Strawberry!

Homemade Cookies and Ice Cream

Make your favorite cookie recipe. Chocolate Chip is a traditional favorite! Depending on cookie size, serve one or two on a plate with scoop of vanilla ice cream.

Ice Cream Sundae

Serve ice cream in a small glass bowl. Top with real strawberries (or fruit of choice), hot fudge, whipped cream, cherry.

Cheesecake

Make your favorite cheesecake recipe and use fruit of choice for topping.

Cupcakes

Bake your favorite cupcakes in colorful liners, frost with your favorite frosting and top with silk flower or soft chocolate candy bite.

Mandarin Orange Jello Delight

Orange Jello, canned Mandarin Oranges Make Orange Jello using canned oranges juice as portion of liquid. Mix in Mandarin Oranges and chill until set. Cut into squares, add a few orange slices on the side and top with whipping cream.

Strawberry Pink Sparkle Cake

Consider making one delicious cake for table centerpieces. This recipe is amazing and should be a hit with most guests. However, any favorite cake flavors work great! Add a lovely, antique cake server with bow, antique cake plates and a candle to make the table glow.

1 box angel food cake mix (baked) 1 C. Boiling water
1 small package strawberry Jello 1 lb. Frozen sliced strawberries
½ pint whipping cream 2 T. Sugar Red food coloring

Make cake and cool completely. Dissolve Jello in water, add frozen strawberries, stirring to break apart. Place cake, widest side down on serving plate. Cut a 1" layer off top of cake and set aside.

Gently hollow out the cake to make a shell to be filled with mixture by cutting within 1" from the sides and 1" from the bottom, gently pulling out the cake and breaking into small pieces.

Mix the cake pieces with the strawberry mixture and pour back into cake shell. Put top back on cake. Whip cream until thick, stir in sugar and food coloring until pink. Spread over entire cake. Decorate with strawberries if desired. Refrigerate at least 1 hour before serving.

Brunch Buffet

If your gathering is a brunch, make simple foods. Consider Egg and Ham with Cheese casseroles, fresh fruit cups, and french toast and sausage with syrup.





Just Desserts

If organizing an elegant after dinner evening, consider a variety of desserts. From chocolate to spice to apple cobblers to whatever your group dreams up will be an event your gals will not forget.

PREVIEW Mug And Muffin

An afternoon gathering for tea and coffee and delicious muffins is always popular. Consider making several delicious muffin recipes and offering creative toppings to try: honey, real butter, peanut butter, cream cheese and others. Add sweet cupcakes for dessert.



Pie and Coffee

Everyone loves a delicious piece of pie. Make them or buy them. You can't go wrong! Add ice cream and whipped topping.

Cakes Galore!

Cakes are the glorious dessert of choice at any event.

So many choices! So many options!

- 1. Bake a variety of cakes and decorate them with thick, creamy frosting in every flavor possible.
- 2. Choose one or two flavors and decorate them with colorful frosting or in the colors chosen as table colors.
- 3. Frost all cakes identically and top with fresh flower petals, small plastic hats (or other party item) or sprinkles.
- 4. Decide whether the cakes will be homemade or provided by a local bakery with that professional touch of frosting and decoration.

NOT FOR USE PLEASE PURCHASE Healthy Options

Provide simple angel food cake topped with strawberries or a small dish of fresh fruit or a similar choice for those who may suffer from diabetes or other health risk. Find out before the event if this option is necessary. Sometimes guests will just say 'no thank you'.

Consider a few choices like spice, carrot or a gourmet recipe found online at one of the many dessert web sites.

My mommy's a gardener and works really hard, Planting and weeding and grooming our year.







Start with "I care, I understand and I'm here for you."


Friend: See? That's why you are the Princess of Everything and I'm your GOOD friend.

Girl: Me? I go to church because you and mom tell me I have to go. I kind of like hats. I'd wear one if you let me pick it out.


Grandma: Hat or no hat, you need to figure out real reason you go to church on Sundays. Let's talk.


Grandma: Teasing me or making fun of my Sunday hat?

One Person Wearing Daisy chain crown in her hair.




See, the grass is full of stars, Fallen in their brightness; Hearts they have of shining gold, Rays of shining whiteness.

This is an optional fun Demonstration segment to teach guests how to make their own old fashioned Daisy Ring. Give each person a printed copy of the directions. Demonstrate the process.

Supplies: a large bunch of daisies or dandelions (@ 25 and that includes extras for error) or mixture of flowers. Purchase these the day of the banquet from your local grocery store or flower shop. If the weather is right and flowers are blooming, visit a nearby field and pick your own. Bring many more flowers than will be used in case of wilting or breakage. Choose inexpensive flowers.




TIP: Before the event, watch YouTube videos that will help to see and learn the process of making a chain. If that is not possible, just show one or two simple options as printed.

How To Make A Simple Daisy Chain

- 1. Pick or buy flowers, making sure to leave length on the stem. Using a fingernail or the end of scissors, carefully pierce the end of the stem.
- 2. Thread the end of another flower into the hole. If the steams are very long, you can intertwine them to make the crown more secure.
- 3. Repeat until you have the desired length, filling in with as many flowers as are available at the moment.
- 4. Trim off each steam and length as much as possible. Leave enough space between the hole and the end of the stem so the hole doesn't open up.
- 5. To finish off the daisy chain crown, make a small hole in the stem below the first flower.
- 6. Insert the end of the chain into the hole and wear! When picked fresh, the Daisy Chain should last many hours.

This gentle activity does your heart good!

How To Make A Flower Head Wreath

There is something gentle, sweet and girlish about a flower head wreath. Wildflower wreaths are delightful. No! They are NOT weeds, they are God's beautiful creation in the wild.

Supplies: Bag ties from bread bags or freezer bags or pipe cleaners or string. Thin wire shaped into a circle. Fresh or fake flowers, greenery, ribbon.

- 1. Place flowers facing outward on the wire circle.
- 2. Wind the stems of the flowers and greenery around the wire.
- 3. Keep in place by twisting a bag tie (pipe cleaner or string) around the flowers. Repeat until the wire is covered in flowers and greenery.
- 4. Finish the wreath by winding ribbon around the wreath, and letting long ribbon float down the back with a bow.

What a beautifully gentle wreath to wear anytime!

If you are like me, every time you have flowers in your hand you think, "Now, how do you do that again?" Who needs diamonds or pearls when you can make beautiful jewelry from flowers you find growing in your yard. Let's learn! (Show and Tell!)

Jesus hardly ever described Himself but you might like to hear a little of what He shared: "Take my yoke upon you and learn of me because I am meek (gentle) and humble of heart." (Matthew 11:28)

Option: Carry bats and gloves




